Again this year, donations were requested for raffle tickets. In the past, raffle tickets were sold as a designated price per ticket.

Many thanks to all who volunteered, donated, and spent their money at the 41<sup>st</sup> annual Sale-A-Rama! It was a great, successful day.

This year's quilt was a beautiful queen sized quilt, log cabin design, in shades of burgundy, rose, and pink. This quilt top was also sewed and designed by Katheryn Martin, and was donated to us by her daughter Dianne Toebben.

**Finance Report.** Gloria Johnson Treasurer, distributed the Finance Report. Net proceeds for 2018 Sale-A-Rama: \$6,165.63!

With proceeds from 2017 Sale-A-Rama, new tables were purchased. High-tech, high-end, very secure wi-fi was installed in Selinger Center (both upstairs and downstairs) and in the Father Ahrens Room, by Huber & Associates. This will enable vendors to accept credit cards, and help with future rent ability of Selinger Center. Also, \$6,000 was donated to Selinger Center Cafeteria Renovations.

Discussion regarding 2018 proceeds. An 1100 watt microwave, a size that will fit an 8x12 pan, for Selinger Hospitality Kitchen will be purchased. Gloria Johnson volunteered to

look for the microwave. Money will be saved in the Sale-A-Rama account for other, later parish needs.

**2019 Sale-A-Rama.** Next year we would like to have several sub-committees, examples: Friday evening/early Saturday morning set-up group, clean-up crews during the event, publicity, Sunday evening group to clean-up, put tables and chairs away.
