





ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

JANUARY 2022- A NEW BEGINNING

Here we are, beginning a New Year. If you are one to make resolutions, keep them simple and attainable. Take stock of your mental and physical health - look at how you can reduce stress and busyness in your daily living, focusing on finding and enjoying the little joys of each day.

The third week of January is Watch your Weight Week – resolve to look closely at your daily diet and exercise routine or non-routine and work to make them a healthier part of your life. There are about 800,000 strokes each year in the United States and many of us have risk factors that could lead to strokes. The CDC (Center for Disease Control and Prevention) notes that: "High blood pressure, high cholesterol and smoking are key risk factors for stroke. About half of Americans have at least one of these three risk factors." Other risk factors include being overweight, being

physically inactive, and drinking too much alcohol. But people can change these things and reduce their risk.

To maintain your weight: Work your way up to 150 minutes of moderate-intensity aerobic activity, 75 minutes of vigorous-intensity aerobic activity, or an equivalent mix of the two each week. Strong scientific evidence shows that physical activity can help you maintain your weight over time. However, the exact amount of physical activity needed to do this is not clear since it varies greatly from person to person.

To lose weight and keep it off: You will need a high amount of physical activity unless you also adjust your diet and reduce the amount of calories you're eating and drinking. Getting to and staying at a healthy weight requires both regular physical activity and a healthy diet.


