Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

HEALTH – All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

MASKS – Masks are strongly encouraged upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask and would like to wear one.

DISTANCE – Pews in the front of the church are now open. We strongly encourage everyone in the front pews to wear masks. The pews in the back of the church will remain in their current configuration of every other pew open to parishioners. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals have now been returned to the pews. Missalettes will be returned to the pews after Pentecost Sunday. A limited quantity of current Missalettes are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a Missalette please take it home with you. Weekly bulletins are currently available in the mailbox at the rectory porch. We will continue to post the song texts for Sunday Mass on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

HOLY COMMUNION – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

TITHING – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANointing of the Sick – If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. Due to COVID restrictions the children are required to sit in certain pews and next to designated individuals.

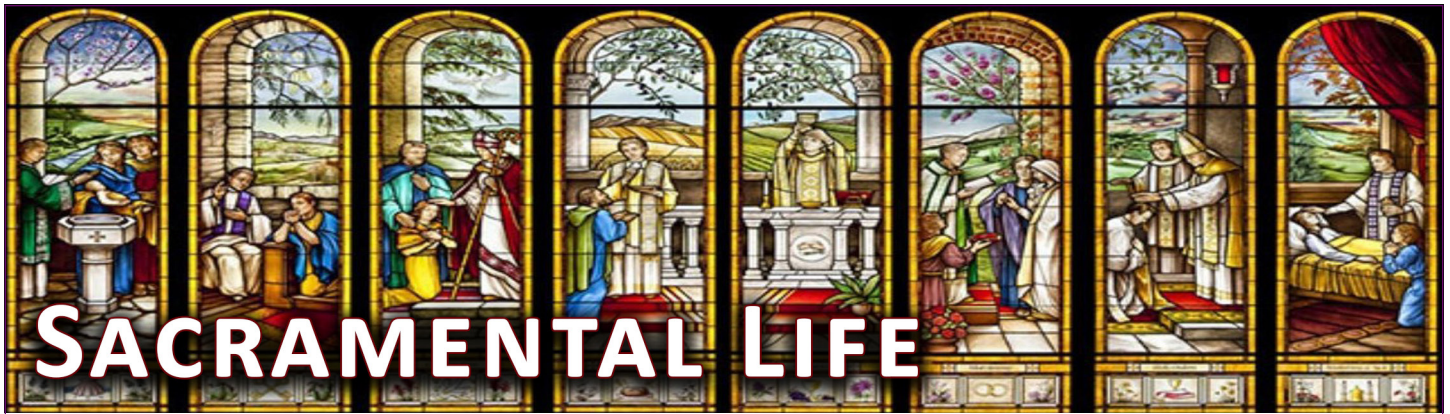

Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

Anointing of the Sick

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.

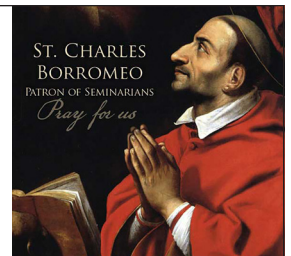

MUSIC NOTES FROM MRS. STUCKY

The pandemic has definitely created a challenge in finding musical activities that do not encourage singing and encourage social distancing. Since singing is minimal, it has been very important to start class with some of our contemporary Christian songs. During Lent, we sang "At the Cross" by Chris Tomlin. Throughout the classes of Holy Week, we sang a couple versions of the spiritual, "Were You There". The students pray so well when the music touches their hearts! To celebrate the Easter season, we have been praying using the song, "I Will Rise" by Chris Tomlin.

The 7th and 8th grade students made homemade instruments this year. The instruments presented by the students varied in many ways. I presented examples of 40-50 different possibilities for instruments for the students. It was amazing to see all of the homemade instrument projects enter the music room! All of the students were excited to see the musical creations! One student used his imagination and created a guitar using Legos!

Since we have the UV-C wand, I am able to disinfect instruments that are shared among students. The students in grades K-6 were able to experiment with an element of music, tone color. There were 10 musical stations set up in the music room. Each student had the opportunity to play 19 instruments with different sounds and methods of playing.

To conclude the year, we are focusing on the various instruments of the orchestra and their families. The students enjoy using the game, Instrument Bingo, to learn more about the instrument's tone color and appearance. Students in grades K-4 are studying about Benjamin Britten and his composition "Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra" using an interactive program offered by Carnegie Hall.

Welcome to May – The month of Mary

Remember to thank God for the beauty of flowers, plants and gardens bursting forth. Working with gardens or even house plants can lift your spirits. Remember, too, that May is the month of the Rosary – pray to Mary for peace and health and respect for all peoples, of all ages, and in all walks of life. Respect for others also includes taking good care of your health.

Spring cleaning and COVID-19 according to the CDC:

Cleaning with a household cleaner that contains soap or detergent reduces the amount of germs on surfaces and decreases risk of infection from surfaces. Disinfection to reduce transmission of COVID-19 at home is likely not needed unless someone in your home is sick or if someone who is positive for COVID-19

has been in your home within the last 24 hours.

Clean high-touch surfaces regularly (for example, daily) and after you have visitors in your home.

Focus on high-touch surfaces such as doorknobs, tables, handles, light switches, and countertops.

Clean surfaces using a product suitable for each surface, following instructions on the product label.

Reduce contamination of surfaces

Take steps in your home to limit contamination of surfaces from airborne particles or from touching surfaces with contaminated hands. Have everyone in your household wash hands often, especially when returning from outside.
