Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following **REVISED** protocols are now in effect for <u>all Masses</u> — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

HEALTH – All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and through November 27, 2020 provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

MASKS – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering and exiting church, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. Masks may be removed while seated in the pew, if so desired. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask. Masks must be worn whenever adequate social distancing of at least six feet cannot be maintained in the pew.

<u>DISTANCE</u> – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

<u>HOLY COMMUNION</u> – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

<u>TITHING</u> – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

St. Peter School Counseling News

Welcome Back to a new school year! August and September are always a time of new beginnings and discovering your purpose for the coming year. To help students with this task, I begin the year with guidance lessons that focus on how students and their surroundings have changed from last year, and OH MY have things changed for this year. Many of these changes we didn't expect or particularly want to happen. Our discussion then moves into coping with changes and we focus on students' strengths, hobbies, and trusted family and friends who they can talk to.

Many things going on in our world and lives today are bringing new challenges. Listed below are some changes you may be noticing in your child(ren). Please reach out for help if these changes are becoming a concern for you or your family: behavioral regression, anxiety, separation issues, physical symptoms (stomach aches), anger, refusal to comply, clinginess, highly emotional, lower grades, constant talk about COVID, or more irritable when routines change or student isn't in control of situation.

There are things you can do at home to help your child(ren) and yourself through these challenging times. The most important thing to remember through it all is that your child does have a purpose for his/her behavior and it is beneficial to discover that purpose in order to address concerns adequately. Here are some tips for managing behaviors: establish and maintain routines, stay calm - your child will feed off your energy, talk about what's going on in the world at your child's level of understanding, validate that you hear your child's concerns (even if you don't agree), be honest, be vulnerable through showing your own emotions and how you cope, start a "worry" journal, jar or prayer to give your worries to God, and do relaxing/fun activities together.

Being the School Counselor at St. Peter brings me great joy and I am very thankful for this time to be together at school! As the School Counselor, I am available to help students, parents and teachers with social/emotional and academic concerns. Please don't hesitate to call or email with questions or concerns.

Alice Kuehn's Nurse Notes

The 2020-2021 flu season is underway

While how long a flu season lasts varies, the average duration of a flu season for the last few seasons has been 16 weeks, with a range of 11 weeks to 20 weeks. Although at this time flu activity is low, now is the time to get the flu vaccine, starting mid-September and preferably by end of October. . Flu vaccination protects against flu illness and reduces the risk of flu complications, including flu-associated hospitalization, admissions to the intensive care unit, and even death. It takes approximately two weeks for the protection provided by vaccination. CDC recommends that everyone 6 months of age and older should receive the vaccine and has worked with vaccine manufacturers to have extra flu vaccine available this flu season. There are many different flu viruses and they are constantly changing. The composition of U.S. flu vaccines is reviewed annually and updated to match circulating flu viruses. Flu vaccines protect against the three or four viruses (depending on the vaccine) that research suggests will be most common. For 2020-2021, trivalent (threecomponent) egg-based vaccines are recommended to contain:

- A/Guangdong-Maonan/SWL1536/2019 (H1N1)pdm09-like virus (updated)
- A/Hong Kong/2671/2019 (H3N2)-like virus (updated) B/Washington/02/2019 (B/Victoria lineage)-like virus (updated) Quadrivalent (four-component) egg-based vaccines, which protect against a second lineage of B viruses, are recommended to contain the three recommended viruses above, plus B/Phuket/3073/2013-like (Yamagata lineage) The quadrivalent high-dose vaccine is licensed for use in adults 65 years and older. This vaccine will replace the previously licensed trivalent high-dose vaccine.

Manufacturers have already begun distributing flu vaccine and will continue to distribute vaccine throughout the season. Vaccine is now available in Jefferson City area at numerous pharmacies and doctor's office. With significant flu possible this season, along with continuing spread of COVID-19, severe flu outcomes are a somber reminder of how serious flu can be, even for otherwise healthy people Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, reducing the spread of respiratory illnesses like flu this fall and winter is more important than ever.

In addition to getting vaccinated, here are some ordinary actions you can take to help prevent the spread of $\underline{\text{flu}}$ germs:

Try to avoid close contact with sick people.

While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them.

If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone for 24 hours without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.) Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. After using a tissue, throw it in the trash and wash your hands. Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way. Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs like flu.

Silver Rose Event at St. Peter Church

Wednesday, September 30 6:00 - 9:00 pm

Our parish has an opportunity to participate in a North American effort paying special tribute to Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas through the Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose – One, Life, One Rose Program. It involves carrying five Silver Roses from Ontario through the U.S. to Monterrey, Mexico.

The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson expanded the program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Ontario.

Today five Silver Roses travel from Canada to the United States to Monterrey, Mexico, arriving at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe there on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The annual effort honors not only Our Lady of Guadalupe, but we also reaffirms our dedication to the sanctity of human life. As Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said, "It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

Starting April, five roses will travel simultaneously through 43 states and provinces before entering Mexico for the final leg of the pilgrimage to Monterrey. The Silver Rose will be stopping at our Parish of St. Peter on September 30th on its journey through the state.
