Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following **REVISED** protocols are now in effect for <u>all Masses</u> — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

<u>HEALTH</u> – All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and through November 27, 2020 provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

<u>MASKS</u> – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering and exiting church, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. Masks may be removed while seated in the pew, if so desired. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask. Masks must be worn whenever adequate social distancing of at least six feet cannot be maintained in the pew.

<u>DISTANCE</u> – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

<u>HOLY COMMUNION</u> – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

<u>TITHING</u> – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

My brothers and sisters in the Lord,

with the passage of the summer months and the shift toward autumn, in a few months Holy Mother Church will be asking us all to pray with the Church triumphant in heaven on All Saints Day and to pray for the Church suffering on All Souls Day. And so as we continue to fight the good fight in the name of Our Lord Jesus here on earth, I need to speak to you about an important, but uncomfortable topic: your funeral plans.

I'm mentioning this topic not to be morbid or gloomy, but out of pastoral concern and solicitude. For some years now, I've been noticing a discernable trend - namely that when a faithful parishioner dies, some families bypass having a Funeral Mass, sometimes just opting for a prayer service at the funeral home or at the gravesite, or nothing at all. Though any offering of prayer is a sign of love, affection and respect for one who has died, Holy Mother Church has more in mind for the final rites of us Catholics when we pass from this world.

Now, some of you might be wondering why some families might opt not to have a Funeral Mass. Some possible reasons are: our culture's unease with suffering and death; the reality of families no longer living in close proximity to each other; some family members not being Catholic, or having an animosity to the Faith; the unfortunate economic pressure from within the funeral industry itself for that which is quicker and cheaper; and finally, the loss of the value of prayer and the Sacred Tradition that has been entrusted to us.

Whether it is in this life, or once we pass from this life and await the Final Judgment, we are all in need of each other's prayers and the prayers of the Church! The funeral rites of the Church have great spiritual value for the loved one who has died as well as for those who are mourning. Having a Funeral Mass is a final act of love and respect offered on behalf of the one who has died.

Let me reiterate a consistent teaching of the Catholic Church:



there is an inestimable value in the offering of Holy Mass. Whether there are 200 or 2 people present for the offering of a Mass, the power and merits of the Life, Death and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ being made Sacramentally present is beyond measure.

The Funeral Mass and it's associated rituals are among the most significant in the Church, as they speak on a variety of levels: for the deceased, as well as the family and friends of those who are left in sorrow.

The Funeral Mass is so much more than just a remembrance of a person or just a "celebration of life" - for we pray that the merits won for us by Our Lord Jesus on His Cross be applied to the deceased. We pray that all their sins be forgiven and that, through God's abundant mercy, they come to share in the Divine life of heaven.

"Never despair of the mercy of God."

St. Isidore of Seville

The Funeral Mass – through the words of Sacred Scripture, the prayers and rites of Holy Mass, complimented by the chants and music proper to the Sacred Liturgy – reminds us all that the grave is not the final and definitive word. Death has been overcome not just by wishful thinking, but only by the death and resurrection of Christ. More often than not, the Funeral Mass brings comfort and strength, as well as a sense of closure to mourners, even if they are not people of faith. Our Lord Jesus desires to strengthen all those who mourn and give the gift of His peace in the midst of loss.

And so, make known to your family and friends your desire for a Funeral Mass celebrated in your parish church when the Lord calls you forth from this life. Have a conversation about your last wishes with your parish priest. Write it down and keep a copy among the important papers that your family will review at the time of your death. Our Catholic faith has a long and wonderful tradition of having Masses offered for our loved ones living and deceased. If you wish to have a Mass or Masses offered for a loved one here at St. Peter Parish, please contact Beverly in the Parish Office (636-8159 ext. 304).

Alice Kuehn's Nurse Notes

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. It's especially important to wash: Before eating or preparing food, before touching your face, after using the restroom, after leaving a public place, After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing, after handling your mask, after changing a diaper, after caring for someone sick, after touching animals or pets. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that

contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid

touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands. Avoid close contact inside your home: Avoid close contact with people who are sick. If possible, maintain 6 feet between the person who is sick and other household members.

Outside your home: Put 6 feet of distance between yourself and people who do not live in your household. Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread virus. Stay at least 6 feet (about two arms' length) from other people. Keeping distance from others is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

Cover your mouth and nose with a mask when around Others. You could spread COVID-19 to others even if you do not feel sick. The mask is meant to protect other people in case you are infected. Everyone should wear a mask in public settings and when around people who do not live in your household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain. Masks should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.

Continue to keep about 6 feet between yourself and others. The mask is not a substitute for social distancing.

Cover coughs and sneezes:Always cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough, sneeze, or use the inside of your elbow and do not spit. Throw used tissues in the trash. Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean

your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.

If surfaces are dirty, clean them. Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.

Then, use a household disinfectant. Most common EPA-registered household disinfectants will work.

Monitor Your Health Daily

Be alert for symptoms. Watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19.

Especially important if you are running essential errands, going into the office or workplace, and in settings where it may be difficult to keep a physical distance of 6 feet.

Take your temperature if symptoms develop. Do not take your temperature within 30 minutes of exercising or after taking medications that could lower your temperature, like acetaminophen. Follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop.

Silver Rose Event at St. Peter Church

Wednesday, September 30 6:00 - 9:00 pm

Our parish has an opportunity to participate in a North American effort paying special tribute to Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas through the Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose – One, Life, One Rose Program. It involves carrying five Silver Roses from Ontario through the U.S. to Monterrey, Mexico.

The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson expanded the program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Ontario.

Today five Silver Roses travel from Canada to the United States to Monterrey, Mexico, arriving at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe there on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The annual effort honors not only Our Lady of Guadalupe, but we also reaffirms our dedication to the sanctity of human life. As Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said, "It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

Starting April, five roses will travel simultaneously through 43 states and provinces before entering Mexico for the final leg of the pilgrimage to Monterrey. The Silver Rose will be stopping at our Parish of St. Peter on September 30th on its journey through the state.
