As you travel around and see the other parishes in our diocese, do you ever notice that the majority of them have their own parish cemetery, many on the same ground as the church? Did you know St. Peter's had their own parish cemetery shortly after it opened in the 1880s? That cemetery is



still in place and is inconspicuously located on the east corner of the now Heisinger Lutheran Home property. As more space was needed, a new cemetery for St. Peter's was opened just to the west. That cemetery is still very prominent on West Main Street. As that cemetery was running out of space, the pastors of St. Peter and the newly opened Immaculate Conception acquired land further west for a shared cemetery. That cemetery is what we all now know to be Resurrection Cemetery on West Truman Blvd. When the Cathedral of St. Joseph parish opened in the 1960s, Resurrection Cemetery became their parish cemetery as well.

Have you ever wondered how decisions are made regarding these three local Catholic cemeteries affectionately known as St. Peter 1, St. Peter 2 and Resurrection Cemetery? Or who all is involved with quality and care of all three cemeteries? The answer is, since St. Peter 1 was opened in the late 1880s, a volunteer board has been in place to oversee operations.

Let us take a moment to introduce ourselves as your St. Peter parish representatives on the Catholic Cemeteries of Jefferson City Board. Along with the three of us, St. Joseph & Immaculate Conception each have three parishioner representatives on the board. The goal of this board to support the working personnel and efforts at Resurrection Cemetery and St. Peter 1 & 2. That support includes budget/financial oversight, products and services offered by the cemetery, facility upkeep/maintenance and long-term planning.

We are happy to provide further information about what the Catholic Cemeteries board does, answer questions about what is going on within the cemeteries, or help anyone become more involved with their local Catholic cemetery. We are fortunate to have a Catholic cemetery for our parish to provide our family and friends' final places of rest. Not all parishes in our diocese have a Catholic cemetery available to them anymore.

Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. 

A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR...

Holy Thursday is the feast that marks the end of Lent and the beginning of the Holy Triduum – the three holiest days of the whole year. In some parts of the world it is called "Great Thursday" because it was on that day of the Last Supper, that Our Lord Jesus celebrated the first Mass and instituted the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders.

At the end of the Holy Thursday Mass, the Eucharist is placed on an "altar of repose" away from the main altar in the sanctuary. It is customary for the faithful to process to this altar and spend time in quiet prayer and adoration. The Roman Missal (#43) states: "The faithful are invited to continue adoration before the Blessed Sacrament for a suitable length of time during the night…"

The Seven Churches Visitation is a tradition that grew out of this time of prayer and adoration. Catholics remember when Jesus asked His disciples to stay and watch with Him while they were in the garden of Gethsemane as His agony began. This tradition of prayerful vigil with the Lord Jesus is a pilgrimage of sorts to various altars of repose in different local churches that



correspond to each of the seven places, or "stations," that were made by Jesus between the Last Supper in the Upper Room to His crucifixion on the cross. The seven stations of Holy Thursday night are:

Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22: 39-46); Jesus bound and taken before Annas (John 18: 19-22); Jesus taken before the Caiaphas, the High Priest (Matthew 26: 63-65); Jesus taken before Pilate (John 18: 35-37); Jesus taken before Herod (Luke 23: 8-9; 11); Jesus taken before Pilate again (Matthew 27: 22-26); Jesus is crowned of thorns and led to His crucifixion (Matthew 27: 27-31)

Upon entering each church or chapel, pilgrims visit the altar of repose, if possible kneel, make the Sign of the Cross, read the appropriate Scripture passage for each station and then engage in a period of private prayer and adoration. At the seventh station, many close their pilgrimage by observing a Holy Hour with Our Lord.

The origin of the Seven Churches Visitation is sometimes attributed to St. Philip Neri (1515-1595) who began a practice of walking to the four major basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Peter, St. Mary Major, St. Paul-outside-the-Walls, and three minor basilicas of St. Lawrence-outside-the-Walls, St. Sebastian-outside-the-Walls, and Holy Cross-in-Jerusalem during Holy Week. From the 16th century on, the practice spread throughout Italy and around the world, particularly in Poland, Mexico and the Philippines. Others hold that the roots of the Holy Thursday pilgrimage are found in St. John's Book of Revelation, in which the seven ancient Churches are visited (Revelation 1-3). No matter what the exact origin is, this year, we will have the opportunity to take up this custom of pilgrimage to visit seven different parish churches on Holy Thursday evening in the Jefferson City area. I am grateful to my brother pastors and their parishioners at the Cathedral of St. Joseph, Immaculate Conception, St. Martins, Wardsville, Taos and Holts Summit for their participation in this venerable and holy custom.

The Seven Churches Visitation is a powerful way to spend time in adoration, meditating on Christ's sacrifice of love for the salvation of souls in preparation for the joy of Easter. There is something very special about visiting churches late into the night – it's not just because of the opportunity to visit other parishes, or see how beautiful their altars of repose might be adorned; rather, it's the intentional acceptance of Christ's request for His disciples to keep vigil with Him, to journey with Him, and to contemplate the gift of His redeeming love which leads to His Cross on Good Friday. I hope that you will consider participating in this pilgrimage with your family and friends this coming Holy Thursday evening.
