A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR...

Dear friends in the Lord -

Just this past week, we received the final insurance payment check for the exterior repairs to all of the buildings at St. Peter Parish in the aftermath of the March 2020 hailstorm. Please find

herein the final financial numbers for that project. While certainly I had hoped to have provided all of this information to you a long time ago, please keep in mind that as we began the project to replace the roofs on the five buildings on campus, because of their age, other issues came to light that needed to be remedied while cranes were available and scaffolding was erected. I am very grateful for the collaborative and wise input of our Parish Property



Committee, Parish Finance Council and Parish Pastoral Council throughout the many years of this endeavor.

And so, might we make a little historical journey together - remembering what was accomplished during the past two years on the exterior of our parish buildings...

We renewed the entire church roof and steeple structure, repairing and replacing broken and





rotted rafters on the nave roof and steeple. The entire church roof was re-decked with 1x4's in order to provide a level, consistent place where upon Vermont slate was hung. The entire steeple structure was rebuilt and reinforced with new lumber. The slate design restored the cross motif on the north and south sides of the nave roof, per the original design when our church was first constructed.

Persistent water penetration in the soft brick masonry of the church building was attended to, with portions of the west parapet wall having to be totally reconstructed. Six tons of new Indiana limestone was fashioned to replace all of the weathered and cracked stone which caps the parapet walls at either end of church. New pinnacles on the tower base were fashioned to replace those that were cracked and damaged. A new lightning-protection system was installed

around the entirety of the church with new copper ground-rods driven deep around the church. New steeple louvers were fashioned from copper in a design more akin to those originally crafted of wood back in 1883. New high-capacity gutters and downspouts were fashioned in a more historically-sensitive design, with new snow guards installed above them. Additional insulation was added throughout the church attic spaces and above the vaults so that we are better stewards of our heating and cooling expenses.

The seven stained-glass windows in the apse of church were repaired and re-leaded, with new exterior frames and tempered glass installed.






New copper crosses were fashioned for both ends of church because of the significant damage that had rendered the original copper unrepairable. The new steeple cross was gilded in gold leaf. New and additional LED lighting was added around church so that the Cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ may be visible to the local community, both during the day and night.

On the Selinger Centre, a new EPDM roof with additional ventilation for the attic space was added, in addition to

restoring a functioning roof hatch for maintenance access. All of the DryVit stucco was recoated.

On the Vogelweid Building, a new EPDM roof was installed and all unnecessary roof penetrations were removed. New high-efficiency air conditioning units were installed, not on the roof, but at an elevation for easier maintenance.

On the 1889 portion of the school building, four(!) built-up layers of roofing were removed. Broken and compromised roof members were repaired and reinforced. Additional ventilation for the attic space was added, along with additional insulation. Wooden walkways, with a functioning roof hatch, were restored for easier maintenance access. Guttering was replaced throughout and new side-door



On the 1930's and 2006 portions of the school building, additional roof insulation was added and unnecessary roof

penetrations were removed before a new EPDM roof was laid.

On the 1885 portion of the rectory, rotted roof decking was replaced and unnecessary roof penetrations were removed – however, one was added: a new rectory kitchen fan vent, so that the culinary creations of any of my associates or houseguests might be readily enjoyed, but not olfactorily remembered for many days thereafter. A new shingled roof in a complimentary color to the church and school was installed.

While there are many more details that could be added, I will spare you. Nevertheless, I am grateful for your continued generosity and stewardship to our beloved parish.

Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. If you are preparing for surgery, please our your priests know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.






