Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following **REVISED** protocols are now in effect for <u>all Masses</u> — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

<u>HEALTH</u> – All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

<u>SEASONAL GATHERINGS</u> – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

<u>MASKS</u> – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

<u>DISTANCE</u> – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

<u>HYMNALS & MISSALETTES</u> – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

<u>HOLY COMMUNION</u> – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

<u>TITHING</u> – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

Again and again I've been asked what the overall schedule is for the restoration work occurring at St. Peter Church. Unfortunately, as there are so many unknown quantities as we continue to discover what has been "out of sight and out of mind" for so long, I have to admit that my default response for a successful completion to the wood, masonry and roofing repairs being made to our beloved


church is: before Easter. Most of that depends on the effects of the pandemic on workers and what kind of winter we have. That said, I'm happy to report that this week, the replacement work on the decking of the steeple has been completed. It is "in the dry" with ice & water guard around the gables and with 40# felt further up. The installation of the slate on the steeple is scheduled to begin next week, per the design that I




shared with you in last week's bulletin. This past week, the copper crosses on either end of the church were removed. Because of the significant damage to both crosses, new ones will be fashioned of copper in an identical manner.

Because the work being undertaken on St. Peter Church is not just repairing and replacing as cheaply as possible what was damaged, but providing for a long-lasting, historically-sensitive restoration of


some elements where possible, we have been in conversation with the metal working designers at the Renaissance Roofing Company regarding the new tower louvers to be installed. It is thought that the original louvers from 1883, with the "scalloped" design along the lower edge, were most likely made of wood, rather than metal. At some point in the early 20th century, the original louvers were replaced with a simplified copper design. To attempt to recreate the original design in copper would be prohibitively expensive and likely would not be as physically strong as the bent straight lower edge.



Protection from illness

the repair of the seven apse windows in church by the Associated Crafts firm – many of which incurred hail damage to the protective glass and frames. However, there are a number of pieces of the stained glass itself which has cracked, bowed and buckled because the build-up of heat between the protective glass and the stained glass has softened the leading between the individual pieces of glass. In order to provide for the overall integrity and longevity of the windows, new ventilated frames and glass are being installed on the apse windows. So if you see scaffolding in the apse, that's why.

As I hope you know, the vast majority of the funds for the church project is coming from insurance. However, with some of the "unknowns and extras" that we have discovered – like the steeple decking deterioration – those are being funded by your generosity to the building and maintenance fund. Providentially, a donor has come forward to provide for the gilding of the steeple cross. If you or your family would like to sponsor or contribute to a particular dimension of the work that is underway, please don't hesitate to contact me.



Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to *check* available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be *scheduled* after approval by the priest and <u>at least</u> a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the parish office to sign up.

Anointing of the Sick

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.

Inquiry sessions are held every Tuesday for those interested in joining the Catholic Church and receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. 


