

### Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following **REVISED** protocols are now in effect for <u>all Masses</u> — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

<u>HEALTH</u> – All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

<u>SEASONAL GATHERINGS</u> – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

<u>MASKS</u> – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering and exiting church, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. Masks may be removed while seated in the pew, if so desired. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask. Masks must be worn whenever adequate social distancing of at least six feet cannot be maintained in the pew.

<u>DISTANCE</u> – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

<u>HYMNALS & MISSALETTES</u> – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

<u>HOLY COMMUNION</u> – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

<u>TITHING</u> – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

# A NOTE REGARDING THE 8:00 AM WEEKDAY MASS ON TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. Due to COVID restrictions the children are required to sit in certain pews and next to designated individuals. This is to mitigate the spread of COVID among the students.

If you are an adult attending the 8:00 am Weekday Mass please sit in the back of the church to ensure the students are able to follow the necessary protocols for them to attend Mass and remain safe.

#### A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

Here's your weekly update on the roofing restoration work occurring on St. Peter Church. Since last week, the re-decking of the steeple has continued in earnest with 584 linear feet of new 1 x 8's installed. However, as the work has moved up the steeple, the rotted condition of the underlying wood has gotten worse, such that some of the vertical structural members are being reinforced with new 2" lumber.

It was discovered that each of the vertical members are inscribed with Roman numerals. Interestingly enough, they are not sequential as one goes around the steeple, perhaps suggesting that the numerals indicate the order in which they were to be installed in the 1880's?


As a special treat this week, I want to show you the new slate design for the restored steeple. As some of you might be aware, the decoration of the tower and steeple has changed over the last 137 years. For example, there used to be eight decorative stone pinnacles at the top of each gable; but they are no longer extant. There also used to be four gabled louvers about half-way up the steeple which were removed at some point in the 1920's. Rectangular shaped slate was used to cover over that area, creating an incongruent band around the steeple. Because of accumulated dirt and weathering, you might not be aware of red slate also being on the steeple.

With the restorative work being performed, we will be using uniformly shaped slate from top to bottom of the steeple. In collaboration with the Renaissance Roofing Company artists, and in conversation with the Parish Property Committee, a historically sensitive pattern for the slate has been developed that helps to accentuate the cross which crowns the steeple, and which also carries with it theological significance – which every Catholic church should.

Beginning at the 24<sup>th</sup> course of slate and again at the 26<sup>th</sup>, there will be two horizontal lines of red slate – these are symbolic of the two natures of Christ. At the 42<sup>nd</sup> course, there will be a single line of red slate symbolic of the union of the human and divine natures of Christ



in one Divine person (also called the Hypostatic Union). At the 60<sup>th</sup> course, there will be a single red slate placed on the four cardinal directions of the steeple, indicating that the Gospel is meant to be proclaimed in every direction. Four is also evocative of the four Evangelists who have as their central focus the life, teaching, passion, death, resurrection, glorification of Jesus Christ and the beginning of His Church under the Holy Spirit's guidance. For those of you who are mathematically minded – and still following me – between the 26<sup>th</sup> and 60<sup>th</sup> courses, there are 33 courses of slate symbolic of the 33 years of our Lord's earthly life.

Is this all too much and too fussy? I say to you: no! Our Catholic churches – which are not just nicely decorated and historically interesting edifices – but are rather sacred places wherein the worship of Almighty God takes place...and the reconciliation of God and humanity continues through the Sacramental life of the Church, the public devotions and the personal, private prayers of His people.

#### **Holy Matrimony**

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to *check* available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be *scheduled* after approval by the priest and <u>at least</u> a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

#### **Baptism**

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the parish office to sign up.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know *before* you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.






