Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following **REVISED** protocols are now in effect for <u>all Masses</u> — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

<u>HEALTH</u> – All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

<u>SEASONAL GATHERINGS</u> – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

<u>MASKS</u> – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

<u>DISTANCE</u> – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

<u>HYMNALS & MISSALETTES</u> – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

<u>HOLY COMMUNION</u> – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

<u>TITHING</u> – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

A NOTE REGARDING THE 8:00 AM WEEKDAY MASS ON TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. Due to COVID restrictions the children are required to sit in certain pews and next to designated individuals. This is to mitigate the spread of COVID among the students.

If you are an adult attending the 8:00 am Weekday Mass please sit in the back of the church to ensure the students are able to follow the necessary protocols for them to attend Mass and remain safe.

A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

Even with the rain last weekend, the craftsmen from Associate Crafts have removed the old protective glass and framing from

the seven apse windows. It has been decided that they will do all of their work from the outside, rather than trying to erect scaffolding around and behind the high altar in church. Most of the repair work to the cracked stained glass panels and window came leading should be able to be completed in place, or at least on campus. Extra support rods will be added to those portions that have suffered from severe deformation. All of the exterior



wood frames will be scraped and repaired as needed, before being painted. New ventilated frames and protective glass will be added to those seven windows.

Earlier in the summer, an architectural evaluation was made of the roof structure of the nave – the main body of the church. Following the recommendations made by that certified architectural firm, repairs were completed last week to the rafters and other structural



supports, some of which had begun to separate or turn. In other places, extra support was provided to cracked or compromised components by "sistering" new 2 x 8's and micro-laminate beams.

It is hoped that this week, weather permitting, repairs to the stone and masonry of the west parapet wall will begin. The long and the short of the situation is: the limestone capstones have become detached from their anchors and are making a slow march downward. Because of the shear weight of these stones, they are pushing against anything in their way – like the two decorative finials on the north and south ends of the wall. The differing kinds of mortar in the joints of the west parapet wall

present substantial evidence that there has been structural movement for decades. During the last tuck pointing work done on the church (in about 2014), separation gaps and cracks were filled - however, they have opened up again almost 1/2". Water penetration between the capstone and masonry joints has deteriorated the brick wall to the

point that it will structurally have

to be rebuilt before new


As mentioned previously, much of the funding for this church project is coming from insurance. However, most of

Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to *check* available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be *scheduled* after approval by the priest and <u>at least</u> a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.



An Advent Message from Bishop W. Shawn McKnight



This Advent promises to be like none other. With the pandemic raging, it is important to find ways to nurture our faith as we look forward to the great feast of the Incarnation, the Son of God becoming one of us.

Many of us will miss being with loved ones in person. Many will also miss the beautiful traditions of small faith groups, penance services, and in-

person parish retreats held during Advent.

But perhaps God can use the effects of the pandemic, even the isolating effect of social distancing, for good. What if we were able to take advantage of this shuttering of our busy lives to observe Advent as our Church has always encouraged us to do: a time of reflection, a time of quieting, a time of stillness, to make room for Christ in our daily lives?

Many parishes in our diocese have a beautiful tradition of forming small faith groups and parish retreats during Advent. This year, you are encouraged to consider meeting virtually or using your immediate household – what we Catholics call the "domestic church" – as a small faith group.

During Advent many will have their children home – even college students. Take advantage of this closeness to pray together, to celebrate the rich traditions of our Church! Get out that family Advent wreath – light the candles in the evening at dinnertime. Bless your Christmas tree. Spend time as a family together in prayer in front of your Nativity scene.

To support you in this, the Diocese recommends using a spiritual journal, such as the Jesse Tree Advent Journal, published by the Dominican Sisters of Mary. It can be ordered from their website or Amazon.

All are also invited to join an online Advent retreat, led by

Redemptorist Father Michael McAndrew. The Spanish-language retreat will be livestreamed at facebook.com/ MinisterioHispanoJC/ at 7 p.m. Monday through Wednesday, Nov. 23-25. The English-language retreat will be livestreamed at facebook.com/diojeffcity/ at 7:30 p.m. Monday-Wednesday, Dec. 7-9.

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops' page for Advent has more resources, including prayers from the prayer book commissioned by the bishops, Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers.

Furthermore, in recognition of how so many of us must focus on caring for those who are ill, supporting our health care professionals and being particularly supportive of our immediate family, the launch of the diocesan pastoral plan will have to be delayed. A new date for the issuance of the diocesan plan will be provided in early 2021. Be assured your priests, parish leadership and diocesan staff are continuing to work on the various elements of their individual parish plan. However, we believe a formal issuance of a pastoral letter and diocesan plan should be postponed until we can give the proper attention to this important moment in the life of our local Church.

Many parishes have organized volunteers to assist those in need. If you know of someone who could use assistance, please reach out to your local parish.

Let us continue to pray for all affected by the pandemic, especially those who have died, those who are ill and their loved ones, our health care professionals, our school teachers and administrators, and all "essential workers." Please join Catholics throughout our diocese in praying to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our patroness, for protection.
