#### Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

**HEALTH** — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

**SEASONAL GATHERINGS** – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

**DISTANCE** – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

**HYMNALS & MISSALETTES** – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

**HOLY COMMUNION** – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

**TITHING** – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

# A NOTE REGARDING THE 8:00 AM WEEKDAY MASS ON TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. Due to COVID restrictions the children are required to sit in certain pews and next to designated individuals. This is to mitigate the spread of COVID among the students.

#### A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

During this past week, a lot of work has taken place on campus. Again, I want to express my gratitude for your patience and flexibility with all the construction work taking place. All of the deteriorating capstones on the top of west parapet wall – approximately 12,000 pounds in total – were removed using a 170' crane.

Once the stone work and copper through-wall flashing underneath was removed, the extent of the masonry repair was revealed. Of historical note, two chimneys with two flues, each were discovered near the top of the wall. These flues, long covered over, would have been from the time that multiple wood stoves heated church.


The old west parapet wall capstones will be replaced with newly-sawed Indiana limestone. But until that stone work arrives, there's a lot of masonry reconstruction that needs to take place.

The copper work on the church steeple has been completed. Because of the relatively nice and dry December weather that we've been having, the removal of the clay tile roofing and multiple layers of tar paper on the cold (north) side of the nave has begun. As part of the restoration (and not just replacement) of the church roof here at St. Peter,

we're going down to the level of the nail-able roof deck to assure

# SLATE FROM CHURCH STEEPLE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE


Due to the damage from the hail storm this past March the roof on several buildings had to be replaced. We were able to salvage the original slate from the church steeple that has been in place since 1883. As you can see from the photos the full slate tiles come in a grey or red color and measure approximately 16"h x 8"w. The red is very limited in quantity. Each slate comes with the St. Peter Catholic Church emblem and rope for hanging. The suggested donation price for the grey slate is \$100.00 and \$150.00 for the red slate. Each tile will come with a certificate







of authenticity on the back. Also available will be custom made Christmas ornaments (far right) which ome in a variety of sizes, approximately 2" to 4". The suggested donation for each ornament is \$20.00. An order form will be available on our Facebook page and our website. Once we receive your form and payment we will contact you as soon as your order is available at the church. We hope you enjoy owning a piece of our history.



#### **Holy Matrimony**

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.





# Health tip for the holidays: Say No to Raw Dough

When you prepare homemade dough for cookies, cakes, and bread, you may be tempted to taste a bite before it is fully baked. But steer clear of this temptation—you can get sick after eating or tasting unbaked products that are intended to be baked, such as dough or batter. Children can get sick from handling or eating raw dough used for crafts or play clay, too. Why? Because raw dough can contain disease-causing bacteria Flour is actually a *raw food*. This means it hasn't been treated to kill germs such as Escherichia coli (E. coli), which causes food poisoning. Harmful germs can contaminate grain while it's still in the field or during flour production. Processing steps like grinding grain and bleaching flour do not kill germs like E. coli. *Bacteria are killed only when food made with flour is cooked.* This is why you should never taste or eat raw dough or batter.

In recent years (2016 and 2019), two outbreaks of *E. coli* infections linked to raw flour made more than 80 people sick. Flour and baking mixes that contain flour have long shelf lives, so it's a good idea to check your pantry to see if you have any flour or baking mixes that have been recalled in recent years. If you have any recalled flour or baking mixes, throw them away.

Raw eggs are another ingredient in uncooked batter and dough that can make you sick. Raw or lightly cooked eggs can contain *Salmonella*, a germ that causes

food poisoning. Eggs are safe to eat when cooked and handled properly. Some companies and stores offer edible cookie dough that uses heat-treated flour and pasteurized eggs or no eggs. Read the label carefully to make sure the dough is meant to be eaten without baking or cooking. (Adapted from a CDC article on food safety.
