Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

HEALTH — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

SEASONAL GATHERINGS – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

DISTANCE – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

HOLY COMMUNION – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

TITHING – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

A NOTE REGARDING THE 8:00 AM WEEKDAY MASS ON TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. Due to COVID restrictions the children are required to sit in certain pews and next to designated individuals. This is to mitigate the spread of COVID among the students.

A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

Christmas greetings to all of you and your families! Although it's late December, lots of work has continued on the St. Peter

campus. By the time that you read this, the new Indiana limestone caps will have been installed on the top of the west parapet wall. Many thanks to Josh Dudenhoeffer and AAA Masonry for their collaborative work with the Renaissance Roofing Company on this part of our church restoration project. Shortly before Christmas, the new 5/8" protective glass was installed by Associated Crafts on



the seven apse windows on the west end of church. All of the cracked and damaged panes of stained glass have been replaced or repaired.

Work has continued on the Vogelweid Building currently housing the Preschool with the replacement of the rubber membrane (EPDM) roofing and the ISO board under it. The roof deck has been re-pitched so that it drains water toward the gutters, rather than pooling atop the building. A couple of older air conditioner condenser units were removed from the roof and new ones relocated to a location that does not require a ladder for servicing and also reduces the number of roof penetrations on the building. A large amount of masonry repair at the gutter line and corners of the structure was accomplished before the new roof flashing and gutters were installed.

The removal of the clay tile and replacement of damaged underlayment has been completed on the north side of the church nave. Once the tile on the south side of the nave is removed, further tuck pointing work will occur on the east parapet wall before the batten system (described in last week's bulletin) will be installed over the 43# felt and ice & water guard.

The second truckload of slate from a quarry in Vermont has arrived and the installation of the steeple slate has begun. This

week I want to share with you another special detail of the restoration of our church exterior: the nave roof cross design. As some of you might be aware, the original roof of our church had a cross design incorporated into the slate that was laid on both the north and south sides of the nave. In collaboration with the Parish Property Committee and the designers



at the Renaissance Roofing Company, we've been working on reestablishing a singular cross design for both sides of the nave roof. It will be created using the rarer red slate that will also be used to punctuate the steeple slate pattern. In the midst of so many governments around the world restricting and forcing the removal of the cross because it is perceived as a threat to





Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.




