
ST. PETER SCHOOL NEWS

PAUL strives to provide support for the poor and needy in ways that are underserved by other organizations. Our goal is to be as generous as possible within our means without duplicating assistance already being provided by other organizations. So far that includes:

• Help prevent utilities from

being disconnected. Having electric, gas, or water service disconnected has a domino effect; without electricity or water the home becomes uninhabitable. Families may become separated as children may be removed from the home. Not having utilities usually breaks the rental lease and the family may become homeless. By stepping in to prevent disconnection we help prevent further crises for the family being served.

- Provide basic twin size mattresses with priority given to children. Many of the people we help have had to move recently and, with no truck available, leave many possessions behind. Mattresses are particularly difficult to move without a truck and so many end up sleeping directly on the floor.
- Other types of assistance may be given, but these are the most common.

ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

On Thursday, December 8, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception affirms that the Virgin Mary was conceived free from original sin by virtue of the merits of her son Jesus. In 1854, Pope Pius IX, declared the Immaculate Conception to be infallible doctrine, and just 4 years later, the Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette Soubirous at Lourdes, and when asked her name, she replied "I am the Immaculate Conception." The miraculous waters of the spring at Lourdes have seen millions of pilgrims seeking healing, and many miraculous cures have been recognized. A prayer from Lourdes says in part "Dear Lady of the Immaculate Conception, remind us often that all people deserve the opportunity to be healed, and help us to treat all whom we encounter with compassion, that we, too, may be conduits of healing...O Mary, Mother of Healing, please ask your son to heal (name of individual and illness).. We ask this in His name, through your intercession, Amen."

On December 12 we celebrate the feast of the Virgin of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas. Mary first appeared to Juan Diego December 9, 1531, on Tepeyac Hill and asked for a church to be built on Tepeyac in her honor. Juan went to the local Bishop with Our Lady's request. The Bishop dismissed him in disbelief and said he would need proof of Juan's story and the lady's identity. On December 12, Juan saw Our Lady again and told her of the Bishop's request. Our Lady instructed Jaun to gather flowers from the top of Tepeyac Hill. Even though it was cold December, Juan obeyed her and found Castilian roses in full bloom which are not native to Mexico. She arranged the flowers in his cloak (tilma) and when he opened the cloak in front of the bishop the flowers fell out. On the fabric was the image of the Virgin of Guadalupe. The Tilma is now on display in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe on Tepeyac Hill near the site of the first apparition. Pope Pius XII accorded the Virgin Mary the title "Patroness of the Americas" in 1946 and Pope John XXIII invoked her as "Mother of the Americas" in 1961.




