




DIVINE MERCY YARD SIGNS





ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

CARING FOR THE CAREGIVER

Have you ever heard of caregiver strain? Someone you know is likely haveing this experience—it may even be you. In the United States, about 1 in 3 adults act as informal caregivers for other adults such as an aging relative, an ill spouse, or a disabled child. Often, this person has a hard time asking for help—which can lead to feeling isolated, frustrated and even depressed. Even the most resilient people are strained by caring for a loved one.

According to the Mayo Clinic, here are some possible signs of caregiver strain:

- Frequently worried or overwhelmed
- Often feeling tired
- Getting too much or not enough sleep
- Weight loss or gain
- Becoming easily annoyed or angry
- Losing interest in favorite activities
- · Feeling sad
- Headaches or body pain
- Overuse of alcohol or drugs, including prescription medications

The Mayo Clinic offers some ways to prevent or reduce caregiver strain.

For you as caregiver: • Accept support. If someone offers meals, errands, or time with the person you are caring for, allow them the blessing of helping you. • Stay positive. Remember that no caregiver is "perfect". • Set realistic goals. Say "no" to requests that can be draining. • Find caregiving resources, services and support groups in your community. • Stay connected with family and friends who can offer nonjudgmental emotional support. • Stay healthy - get enough sleep, regular exercise, maintain a healthy diet, and drink plenty of water. • Tell your doctor that you're a caregiver

Support a caregiver: Be understanding, supportive, and offer practical assistance such as taking care of the one being cared for to allow the caregiver some time to refresh and possibly do the shopping they need to do. You could also make time to spend with him/her. A dinner, a phone call, or a walk together can go a long way.
