### Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

**HEALTH** — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

**SEASONAL GATHERINGS** – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS – Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

**DISTANCE** – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

**HYMNALS & MISSALETTES** – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

**HOLY COMMUNION** – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

**TITHING** – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

# A NOTE REGARDING THE 8:00 AM WEEKDAY MASS ON TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. Due to COVID restrictions the children are required to sit in certain pews and next to designated individuals. This is to mitigate the spread of COVID among the students.

If you are an adult attending the 8:00 am Weekday Mass please sit in the back of the church to ensure the students are able to follow the necessary protocols for them to attend Mass and remain safe.

### A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Rorate Caeli Mass in Honor of Our Lady will be held on Wednesday, December 23, 2020 at 6:00 am.

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. The interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning



of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world.

The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8:

"Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem."

"Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour."

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ.

The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel, and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord.

### **SLATE FROM CHURCH** STEEPLE AVAILABLE FOR **PURCHASE**

Due to the damage from the hail storm this past March the roof on several buildings had to be replaced. We were able to salvage the original slate from the church steeple that has been in place since 1883. 

### **Holy Matrimony**

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

### **Baptism**

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

### **Anointing of the Sick**

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.





### **ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES**

On Tuesday December 8th, we celebrate the Feast of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception affirms that the Virgin Mary was conceived free from original sin by virtue of the merits of her son Jesus. In 1854, Pope Pius IX, declared the Immaculate Conception to be infallible doctrine. Four years later, the Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette Soubirous at Lourdes. When asked her name, she replied "I am the Immaculate Conception," an acknowledgement of the recently declared dogma. A prayer from Lourdes says in part "Dear Lady of the Immaculate Conception, remind us often that all people deserve the opportunity to be healed, and help us to treat all whom we encounter with compassion, that we, too, may be conduits of healing...O Mary, Mother of Healing, please ask your Son to heal (Name the illness).. We ask this in His name, through your intercession. Amen"

On December 12 we celebrate the feast day of the Virgin of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas. Mary first appeared to Juan Diego December 9, 1531, on Tepeyac Hill,

near Mexico City. She identified herself as the Virgin Mary, and asked Juan to tell the Bishop that a church was to be built on that site in her honor. Rejected by the Bishop and in need of a priest for his dying uncle, he tried to avoid Our Lady by taking a different route around the hill. She appeared and gently asked why he didn't seek her help, "¿No estoy yo aquí que soy tu madre?" (Am I not here, I who am your mother?) She assured him that his uncle was fully recovered and told him to gather flowers from the

top of Tepeyac Hill. Juan obeyed her and found Castilian roses (out of season and not native to Mexico) in full bloom. She arranged the flowers in his cloak (tilma) and when he opened the cloak in front of the bishop the flowers fell out and on the fabric was the image of the Virgin of Guadalupe. Because the image on the tilma depicts Mary during her pregnancy, Our Lady of Guadalupe has become the



patroness of the pro-life movement and her intercession is sought for the protection of the unborn and an end to abortion. We ask Blessed Marv. Immaculate Mother of God, patroness of our United States, and Mother of the Americas to pray for our county and all the Americas, that there may be an increased effort to protect the unborn and expanded efforts to

assist expectant mothers.
