Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

If you are preparing for surgery, please let our priests know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.



FREE BOOK FOR LENT

For well over a hundred years now, many scholars have questioned the historical truth of the Gospels, claiming that they were originally anonymous. Others have even argued that Jesus of Nazareth did not think he was God and never claimed to be divine. As The Case for Jesus will show, recent discoveries in New Testament scholarship, as well as neglected evidence from

ancient manuscripts and the early church fathers, together have the potential to pull the rug out from under a century of skepticism toward the traditional Gospels. Above all, Pitre shows how the divine claims of Jesus of Nazareth can only be understood by putting them in their ancient Jewish context. Books are available at church entrances.

LENTEN REGULATIONS AND ADMONITIONS

As another Lenten journey of conversion begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22, and ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, Holy Mother Church calls all Catholics to a deeper spirit of penance, fasting, almsgiving and prayer, "which express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others" (Catechism of the Catholic Church Nos. 1434 and 1969).

To foster a greater spirit of penance, of reparation for sin, to encourage self-denial, and so guide us more closely in the footsteps of Christ, Holy Mother Church reminds us of the following obligations of fast and abstinence during Lent and also admonishes us all to deeper prayer and worship.

Abstinence: all persons who have already celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.


Fasting: everyone, from the celebration of their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent is highly recommended. But please note: when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. These are minimal penitential practices and should not be lightly excused. If in doubt, please consult your parish priest. Other recommended forms of fasting, as regards alcoholic drink, needless television, video games, internet use, and social entertainment, are of true spiritual value and strongly encouraged.

Almsgiving: The act of giving to the poor, in the most ancient tradition of the Church, is an expression of penance, a witness of fraternal charity, and an expression of Lenten conversion. Therefore, all Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church: through regular stewardship to their parish and support of charities.

Prayer: In order to deepen one's love for Christ, Catholics are urged all the more to participate in the sacramental life of the Church during Lent by attending daily Mass and frequenting the Sacrament of Penance.

SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL, ST. PETER CONFERENCE WAS VERY BUSY IN 2022.

The committee received more than 350 phone calls and

provided assistance to 336 individuals or families. Twenty- four beds for children were provided. One hundred fifty-six volunteer hours and six hundred volunteer miles were recorded. We thank you as we could not provide assistance to those in need, if it were not for your generous donations!

Most of the financial assistance was for utilities to prevent disconnection, or fuel to get to work or doctor appointments. We try to provide services that are not provided by other agencies. One such case was helping a grandfather get to St. Louis to be at the bedside of his dying grandson.

We also refer many people to other agencies that can help them, such as the local food pantries.

SVDP also provides a monthly meal at the Salvation Army. We continue to feed 35-45 people the first Wednesday of the month. We could use more volunteers to bring and or serve food. Several SVDP members as well as other parishioners, volunteer at The Jefferson City Room at the Inn. JCRATI is a winter low barrier shelter for the homeless. The shelter is located at Catholic Charities and is supported by several community churches and other members of the community. More than a dozen homeless men and women are being housed each night, and an evening and breakfast meal is provided. Thank you to all the parishioners that have volunteered to provide a meal or work a shift!

ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

LENT: A TIME OF RENEWAL

On Ash Wednesday we pray that God our Father will fill us with the Holy Spirit, purify our hearts, and strengthen us in love. We ask the Holy Spirit: "may we be filled and satisfied by the word which you give us, to be loving in the ordinary events of daily life, to abstain from what we do not really need, and to help our brothers and sisters in distress." Think about how you can make Lent holy through both self-denial and positive action. Can Lenten discipline help you be more attentive to your physical, mental and spiritual health? Maybe you could revisit new year's resolutions and pick one or more to renew. Maybe volunteer as a caring neighbor and bring Holy Communion to those homebound, visit our parishioners in nursing homes, help out at Catholic Charities, St. Vincent de Paul, the Samaritan Center, etc. Pray to the Holy Spirit to guide you on your journey.

A NOTE FROM GASTON DE LA TORRE: A few years ago St. Peter Catholic Church acquired a hearing assistance system that greatly improved my listening and enjoyment of the Mass. If you have hearing problems, difficulty with the clarity of the speech of the speaker, or if you use hearing aides equipped for use with telecoil loop systems, you should give it a try. There are two ways to use



the hearing assistance system. 1) Use the receiver with the ear chord provided, or you may be able to use your own ear chord to connect to the receiver. 2) Use the receiver with one of the two telecoil loops provided if your hearing aides have a telecoil setting (this is the way I prefer using it, because it feeds the voice directly to my hearing aides). The hearing assistance equipment is kept in the closet located at the side ramp entrance to the Church. There is a sign-out book to help keep track of the hearing aide usage, and to let the church know if they need to acquire more units.


