Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

HEALTH — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

SEASONAL GATHERINGS – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS — Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

DISTANCE – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

HOLY COMMUNION – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

TITHING – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.


A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR...

Dear friends in the Lord -

here's hoping that all of your have been able to stay warm as the past week has been a not so subtle reminder of what Midwestern winters can be. Although the Renaissance crews had continued to work once the mercury dropped below freezing, the addition of the snow and sub-zero temperatures has paused the exterior restoration work. That said, last week I drove up to Belvidere, Illinois to visit the Renaissance company workshop where all of our new copperwork is being fabricated.

The first photo that I want to share with you is of the pieces that come together for the fashioning of the gutter supports for the

nave of church (#1 & #2 are fabricated into #3). Because of the large dimensions of the new guttering, the supports have been fashioned so as to provide strong support, thus preventing the sags and low




spots that our previous gutters had.

Other parts of the new steeple cross are coming together nicely.

By this point, the cross should have been sent to Boston for gold gilting. Once it is completed, I will inform you of the date for the blessing of the new steeple cross before it is installed.

Work on the east end of church before the snow arrived revealed further masonry deterioration under the stonework above the two narthex entrances. Once the temperature climbs back above



freezing, masonry repairs will be made so that the new copper counterflashing will have strong joints to hold it in place for the next century. If the weather cooperates, the east parapet wall capstones will be







ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

WHAT IS THE COVID-19 VACCINE? COVID-19 mRNA vaccines teach our cells how to make a piece of a protein to trigger an immune response and build immunity to the virus that causes COVID-19. mRNA does not affect or interact with a person's DNA, and the cell breaks down and gets rid of the mRNA as soon as it is finished using these instructions. There are two COVID-19 vaccines currently authorized and recommended for use in the United States, and three other vaccines are currently in large-scale clinical trials. COVID-19 vaccines currently available in the United States have been shown to be highly effective at preventing COVID-19. To learn more about the different vaccines for COVID-19 and how vaccines work, visit the CDC website.

None of the COVID-19 vaccines currently authorized for use in the United States uses the live virus that causes COVID-19. You may have symptoms like a fever after you get a vaccine. This is normal and a sign that your immune system is learning how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19.

WHY SHOULD I GET THE COVID-19 VACCINATION? It is an important tool to help stop the pandemic. Wearing masks and social distancing help reduce your chance of being exposed to the virus or spreading it to others, but these measures are not enough. Vaccines will work with your immune system so it will be ready to fight the virus if you are exposed. The combination of getting vaccinated and following CDC's recommendations to protect yourself and others will offer the best protection from COVID-19. Experts believe that getting a COVID-19 vaccine may also help

keep you from getting seriously ill even if you do get COVID-19.

WHAT DO THEY MEAN BY "HERD IMMUNITY"? Herd immunity means that enough people in a community are protected from getting a disease because they've already had the disease or they've been vaccinated. Herd immunity makes it hard for the disease to spread from person to person, and it even protects those who cannot be vaccinated, like newborns. How many people need to get a COVID- 19 vaccine for herd immunity to take effect? While experts don't yet know what percentage of people would need to get vaccinated to achieve herd immunity, vaccination is a safer way to build protection than getting sick with COVID-19.

LOCATION OF PARISHIONERS WHO ARE HOSPITALIZED OR HOMEBOUND: Please call or email to let us know if you or a family member is hospitalized or homebound and/ or if you would like the parish nurse to call, pray with you and/or assist you with questions and health care concerns. Remember that if you or a family member moves from hospital to home or rehab center or nursing care facility, the hospital cannot tell us your location due to HIPPA regulations. 
