NURSE'S NOTES

Spotlighted Column Topics: cancer screening & prevention, Lent, spiritual-physical health interrelatedness

February has been recognized as National Cancer Prevention Month since 2004. Yet the importance of cancer prevention has been recognized for 80+ years since FDR declared April to be Cancer Control Month in 1940 (Cancer Health, n.d.). In April 2024, former President Biden signed a proclamation to declare April as National Cancer Prevention & Early Detection Month. Many current, reputable resources acknowledge February for this health topic, while others focus on April. With the vast number of cancer types & subtypes, rapidly changing approaches to cancer therapy, and cancer being the second leading cause of death in the United States (CDC, 2025) ~ perhaps it is fitting we have 2 months dedicated to this purpose. As a Parish Nurse in 2026 (writing this on Ash Wednesday ☺), I find it compelling that for *most* years, these 2 months perfectly align with the beginning & end of Lent.

As I ponder that one of our pillars in Lent is fasting, it occurred to me that one of the premier cancer screening strategies ~ routine colonoscopies ~ involves a form of fasting for procedural preparation. Contemplating the unpopular preparation required for colon-viewing procedures and staunchly believing in the interrelatedness of all 8 wellness dimensions, the following parallel emerged in my mind. Lent is “a period of **preparation** to celebrate the Lord’s Resurrection at Easter” during which “we **practice self-control** through **fasting**. We are called not only to **abstain from luxuries** during Lent, but to a **true inner conversion** of heart as we seek to **follow Christ’s will** more faithfully” (USCCB, 2026, para. 1). I added the color and bold emphasis to the USCCB quote above, to better illustrate the spiritual-wellness/physical-wellness correlation I aim to elucidate below.

- Colonoscopies and other screening procedure **preparations** also require us to **practice self-control**, such as a limited diet (**fasting**) and/or not eating (abstaining) for a certain timespan beforehand.
- Cancer prevention strategies often require us to **abstain from things we enjoy / luxuries** ~ such as avoiding tobacco products and minimizing sun exposure, saturated fat and sugar consumption, and alcohol intake.
- Our daily habits, as well as strategies we take to preserve and/or check-in-on our health, can certainly allow for a **true inner conversion** of our physical body/health. There are many amazing examples of this ~ a poignant example is how lung tissue transforms over time when smoking is stopped and healing can occur.
- The results from screening procedures for cancer and other diseases provide us more information on our bodily health, so we can then make treatment decisions honoring and **following Christ’s will** for our physical bodies.

If you’ve been needing a nudge towards discussing (and scheduling, if applicable) your own colorectal screening, this column is your God-wink. If you’re still not convinced, here’s another Lent-aligned sign: Cancer prevention is honored in both February and April, aligning with Lent’s beginning and end in most years; guess which month is **National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month**? March! ... between the 2 months and totally enveloped within Lent most years.



National Cancer Prevention Month advocates for prevention and early detection for **all** cancer types. While I am focusing on colonoscopies and other colorectal screening methods in this piece, this is not to deter from the importance of following guidelines for prevention and screening of other cancers. Indeed, those too will be spotlighted in future columns.

WHISTLEBLOWER HOTLINE

The Diocese of Jefferson City has updated their website to include a new whistleblower hotline that anyone can use to report financial misconduct, human resources concerns, or any other issues. **The hotline number is: 573-635-0386**. Information about the hotline is available at the top of the **diojeffcity.org** webpage via the "Report Abuse or Misconduct" link. This page also includes instructions for the existing methods of reporting abuse. The new whistleblower hotline is available in both English and Spanish. Callers are prompted to leave a message with their concerns. The message will immediately be sent by email to three people — one Chancery employee and two lay people who are not employees of the diocese. The three will confer and ensure the issue is properly investigated. All parishes are encouraged to inform the faithful about the whistleblower hotline and to use it for any concerns that arise.
