THE VERB by Msgr. Kurwicki

The Bishops of the United States launched their National Eucharistic Revival vision in 2021. Their goal was to increase understanding of the Eucharist, as well as encouraging people to attend Mass. It is said that only 25% of Catholics go to church on weekends. This revival is to encourage a renewed movement to unite us with Jesus in the Eucharist. This revival will conclude on Pentecost weekend of 2025. However, before that date, a national pilgrimage will arrive in the Diocese beginning on July 1 with 12 pilgrims who are making their way from San Francisco to Indianapolis. The eight pilgrims accompanied by two seminarians and two priests will be in our diocese and make stops in Sedalia, Boonville and Jefferson City. Our parish has the privilege of hosting Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament in our parish church on July 4. I would like for you to mark the date and to make plans to be present throughout the course of this day as you are downtown for local celebrations. We want to show these visitors that the faith at our parish is strong, youthful and alive! Please watch the bulletin for more details.

Happy Catholic Schools Week! As we reflect on the rich history of St. Peter Catholic School, we are compelled to express our deepest gratitude for your unwavering generosity and continued support of our parishioners. This year, we celebrate 170 years as a school community.

From its humble beginnings in 1854 to the present day, the school has been a beacon of light in our community. Thanks to the dedication and vision of its founders and the ongoing commitment of each and every one of you. The milestones and transformative moments in our school's history are a testament to the strength of our parish community.

The journey began seven years after the parish's foundation. The first school building was erected with a vision to provide quality education in a nurturing environment. By 1858, as the need for more space arose, the first St. Peter Church became the second school building, demonstrating the adaptability and growth of our educational institution.

In 1868, the arrival of the School Sisters of Notre Dame, alongside lay teachers, marked a significant chapter in our school's story. The school sisters taught alongside the lay faculty until around 2012. The construction of the present school in 1889-90, designed by United in Faith and Community Frank Miller and built by H.J. Wallau, reflected a commitment to excellence in architecture and education.

The historical significance of St. Peter School as the "Ninth Capitol of Missouri" after the Capitol building fire in 1911 is a remarkable testament to the community's spirit of service. Msgr. Selinger's generous offer of the school to be used as the House of Representatives by the state, free of charge, during that time exemplifies the deep sense of community cooperation.

In 1931, St. Peter High School was established, followed by the arrival of the Christian Brothers. The commitment to providing a Catholic education to students of all learning abilities led to the founding of the Vogelweid Learning Center in 1964, a testament to the inclusivity and accessibility championed by our community. Starting in the 2024 school year, St Peter Vogelweid will continue to serve students at Helias Catholic, continuing their education in the High School setting with Vogelweid at Helias Catholic School. We are proud of our partnership with Helias Catholic and are excited to continue to help children receive a Catholic education.

As we express our gratitude for the past, we also extend our thanks for the present. Currently serving 490 students, St. Peter Catholic School is the second-largest Catholic school in the Diocese of Jefferson City. Your unwavering support has enabled us to maintain a standard of excellence in education, ensuring that our students receive academic knowledge and a strong foundation in their faith. This year, we celebrated Tanya Dallmeyer receiving the Herzog Foundation Christian Teacher of the Year and welcomed Monsignor Kurwicki to St. Peter. We are proud to have staff that continues to inspire our students to grow academically and spiritually.

St Peter is proud of our partnership with St Andrew Catholic Parish. Just as St. Andrew and St. Peter complemented each other in their discipleship journey, our parishes collaborate to provide a faith-filled education that emphasizes academic excellence and the development of strong faith-based values. 
