SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

BAPTISM

The first step in planning a wedding is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.



ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY (SVDP) END OF 2023 YEAR REPORT

The volunteers of SVDP gave more than 600 hours of service, travelled more than 2,600 miles, and were able to help more than 1,300 people in 2023. It is through the generosity of our St. Peter parishioners and benefactors that we can provide these services! Thank you! Thank you! Thank You!

You have given more than \$37,000 to the work of St. Vincent DePaul this year.

Thanks to an additional \$5,000 grant for children's beds from Catholic Charities of Northern & Central Missouri, more than \$42,000 has been invested in helping our neighbors in need this year.

Through your generous donations, you have been able to help many families keep their lights on, stay warm in the winter and cool in the summer. You have provided fuel for people to get to work, or to doctor's appointments. You have helped three families escaping domestic violence get resettled in a safe environment. You have provided shelter for several stranded families, and 27 children are no longer sleeping on the floor every night.

You have also supported those in need by providing one group meal every month at the Salvation Army Shelter. Carol and Randy England facilitate this program with SVDP purchasing the meat, and volunteers bringing side dishes, and helping to serve the shelter residents and other community members that attend.

SVDP also connects with the community by supporting the annual Homeless Connect Project and encouraging volunteers to assist at the Jefferson City Room at the Inn winter shelter.

Our committee is small but mighty! Please consider becoming a phone volunteer or providing food for the Salvation Army dinner. SVDP often gets calls for transportation to church, assistance in moving furniture, making small home repairs, car repairs, or lawn work. If this sounds like a service you would be willing to provide to those in financial need, please let us know.

Again, thank you for your generosity. In the words of St. Vincent de Paul, "Charity is the cement which binds communities to God and persons to one another... and what are we doing if we are not doing God's will?"


The Jefferson City Civil Pilots: From Lincoln University to Tuskegee Airmen





Aviation captivated young men before World War II, regardless of their skin color. But few Black enthusiasts had access, means or opportunity until the Civil Pilot Training program. Lincoln University of Missouri and the old Jefferson Airfield offered the only program west of the Mississippi River exclusively for Black pilots. Fulfilling the dream of the school's founders, many successful Lincolnites joined the Tuskegee Airmen, the U.S. military's first Black aviation units. Wendell Pruitt's aerial acrobatics were legendary, and Wilbur Long was one of twenty-two to survive Nazi POW camps. Clovis Bordeaux went on to be one of the first Black rocket scientists, and Charles Anderson became a pioneer in satellite meteorology. Michelle Brooks explores Lincoln's men and moments in their pursuit of Double Victory.
