#### **Holy Matrimony**

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.



The Eucharist is the source of our Catholic Stewardship Appeal. # PROMISE TO PLEDGE TO HEAL

The Diocese updated its Safe
Environment requirement last year for
volunteers to serve in the parish. That
policy currently states: "All volunteers
who serve more than once per year
are required to take the VIRTUS Safe
Environment training, sign the Pastoral
Code of Conduct, and submit to a
background check (focused only on Child
Abuse and Neglect) in order to serve."

What does this mean for you as a volunteer, who is the vital life source of St. Peter Parish? Do you have to go through VIRTUS Safe Environment training? Do you have to have a background check?

The response is: if you work with children - yes; if you don't work with children - possibly not. (no)

Listed below are answers to some of the frequently asked questions we have received:

I am a grandparent, why are you asking me to go through this training? While you are at St. Peter Parish, do you do any volunteer work that involves children so you can be more involved with your grandchildren? If the answer is yes, then because you are interacting with children while at St. Peter Parish then you do need to go through VIRTUS training.

I only volunteer as a Eucharistic Adorer, Choir member, or bring food for Funerals, why do I need to go through VIRTUS? While the Diocese would prefer that anyone who volunteers in any capacity go through VIRTUS, unless you are interacting with children or in a leadership role, you will not be required to be VIRTUS certified at St. Peter Parish.

Why is there a background check and who has access to this information? If you are interacting with children, there is a background check to ensure that you have not been convicted of a crime involving physical or sexual abuse of a minor. Only one person at the Diocese and the pastor has access to this information. This information is not shared with anyone else at the Diocese or St. Peter Parish.

What happens if I was convicted of a crime? Only the pastor has knowledge of any serious crimes that an individual may have been convicted of in the past. Many

times, as teenagers or young adults, someone may have chosen to commit an unwise action, such as speeding or gotten into an altercation. These actions happened in the past and shall remain in the past.

So why is this all coming up now and I am receiving information that I need to be VIRTUS trained in order to Volunteer at St. Peter Parish? Primarily because the Diocese has updated its Safe Environment requirement and is asking that all volunteers be VIRTUS compliant. In addition, the Diocese is currently auditing each parish to see where each parish currently stands in their VIRTUS compliance.

As of this writing, St. Peter Parish is 100% VIRTUS compliant with anyone who directly interacts with children. In addition, 53% of all volunteers at St. Peter Parish are VIRTUS compliant.

While the Diocese would prefer that every individual who volunteers in any capacity be VIRTUS certified, we understand that such strict adherence is not always necessary. The pastor will determine if an individual who is not VIRTUS certified needs to become VIRTUS certified.

#### **ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES**

**HEALTHY EATING TIPS**: Healthy eating is about more than just being sure you eat a balanced meal. It also includes focusing on special aspects of a healthy diet: healthy fats, watching sodium intake, increasing your fiber and having a variety of colors on your plate!

Add healthy fats. Not all fats are bad. Foods with monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fats are important for your brain and heart. Limit foods with trans fats which increase the risk for heart disease. Good sources of healthy fats include olive oil, nuts, seeds, certain types of fish, and avocados. Avocados are full of healthy fats. Top a salad or try some avocado in your morning smoothie. Sprinkle nuts or seeds (like slivered almonds or pumpkin seeds) on soups or salads. Add a fish with healthy fats, like salmon or tuna, into your meals twice a week. Swap processed oils (like canola or soybean oil) for oils that are cold-pressed, like extra-virgin olive oil and sesame oil.

Cut the sodium. Good nutrition is about balance, and that means not getting too much of certain ingredients, such as sodium (salt). Sodium increases blood pressure, which raises the risk for heart disease and stroke. About 90% of Americans 2 years or older consume too much sodium. For most people ages 14 years and older, sodium should not exceed 2,300 mg per day. Avoid processed and prepackaged food, which can be full of hidden sodium. Many common foods, including breads, pizza, and deli meats, can be sources of hidden sodium. At the grocery store, look for products that say "low sodium." At restaurants, ask for sauces and dressings on the side. Instead of using salt, add flavor to your meals with a squeeze of fresh lemon juice, a dash of no-salt spice blends, or fresh herbs.
