A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in the Lord -

On this Third Sunday of the Year, in both our First Reading from Nehemiah and the Gospel from St. Luke, we hear of both Erza the Scribe and Our Blessed Lord Jesus reading the Sacred Scriptures in public. Erza reads the from the Torah on a specially constructed elevated wooden platform; whereas Our Lord reads from a scroll of the Prophet Isaiah in the synagogue in Nazareth. And so I thought it an opportune time to talk about our restored pulpit...or is it an ambo...or is it a lectern?

I've noticed that Catholics will often use the terms ambo, lectern and pulpit interchangeably...but there are distinctions to be made. Historically, these terms were used to identify different things, and each had its own specific purpose within the Liturgy of the Church. A lectern is a free-standing (and even portable) table from which announcements are announced or a cantor chants. The distinction between an ambo and a pulpit is a bit more involved.

The word "ambo" comes from a Greek word meaning an "elevation" or even "mountain". Since at least the 4th century, when we Christians began constructing our own church buildings in the relative religious freedom allowed by the Edict of Milan within the Roman Empire, there developed a custom of using a raised platform to chant or read the Epistle (a reading from St. Paul's letters) and the Gospel. In a spiritual sense, the ambo is connected to Moses ascending Mount Sinai to receive the Commandments from Almighty God (Exodus 31); the instruction of the Lord in Isaiah 40 to "Go up a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings"; and the action of Jesus in Matthew 5 when He "went up on the mountain, and ... opened His mouth and taught".

As the Liturgical life of the Church continued to develop, in some places, two ambos were put in place to distinguish between the Epistle and the Gospel. The Epistle ambo was on the southern side of the sanctuary, whereas the Gospel ambo was located on the northern side of the church. (The Epistle and Gospel sides of the sanctuary are architectural terms still in use today).

Eventually, as the size of churches grew larger because of architectural advances, and modern amplification systems had yet to be created, a separate elevated platform primarily used for preaching developed...hence, the pulpit. The pulpit was located close to the center of the nave (the place where the people stood) and was highly elevated to allow the priest or bishop to adequately address the congregation, often times with a canopy over the pulpit, to help deflect the sound downward toward the people.

In technically architectural terms, an ambo is a free-standing structure, whereas a pulpit is attached to a pillar. And so, in St. Peter Church, I hope that you can appreciate that our ambo or pulpit fulfills the liturgical expectations of both: the place wherein God's Holy Word is proclaimed and the homily is given.

The General Instruction on the Roman Missal (#309) expresses it this way: It is appropriate that generally this place be a stationary ambo and not simply a movable lectern. The ambo must be located in keeping with the design of each church in such a way that the ordained ministers and readers may be clearly seen and heard by the faithful... The dignity of the ambo requires that only a minister of the word should stand at it.



ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

HEALTHY EATING TIPS (CONT.)

Bump up your fiber. Fiber in your diet not only keeps you regular, it also helps you feel fuller longer. Fiber also helps control blood sugar and lowers cholesterol levels. Fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grains, and legumes (beans and peas) are good sources of fiber. Slice up raw veggies and keep them in to-go baggies to use as guick snacks. Start your day off with a high-fiber breakfast like whole grain oatmeal sprinkled with pecans or macadamia nuts. Steam veggies rather than boiling them. When buying frozen veggies, look for ones that have been "flash frozen." Add half a cup of beans or peas to your salad to add fiber, texture, and flavor.

Aim for a variety of colors on your plate. Foods like dark, leafy greens, oranges, and tomatoes—even fresh herbs—are loaded with vitamins, fiber, and minerals.

Sprinkle fresh herbs over a salad or whole wheat pasta. Make a red sauce using canned tomatoes (look for "low sodium" or "no salt added"), fresh herbs, and spices. Add diced veggies like peppers, broccoli, or onions to stews and omelets to give them a boost of color and nutrients.

Are you eating healthy to help you get to a healthy weight? According to the Dietary Guidelines for Americans a healthy eating plan emphasizes fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and fat-free or low-fat milk and milk products; a variety of protein foods such as seafood, lean meats and poultry, eggs, legumes, soy products, nuts, and seeds; low in saturated fats, trans fats, cholesterol, salt (sodium), and added sugars; and stays within your daily calorie needs.
