

Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

Anointing of the Sick

If you are preparing for surgery, please let our priests know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.


CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP APPEAL





A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ -

I think that it would be fair to say that what transpired and what we have experienced during the previous two years will have residual effects for years to come. How the coronavirus effected church communities is a hot topic of study and debate. Across the country, very few, if any parish now has the same or greater number of faithful attending Mass or participating in the life of their parish as they did in 2019.

But, we are called to be a people of hope, not of despair! We are called to serve the Lord and one another, no matter our age or the circumstances of life! With that in mind, I'm extending an invitation to those who years ago, served Mass, but have since graduated high school, completed college and perhaps have even retired. Although you don't necessarily need to remember your Latin responses (Ad Déum qui laetíficat juventútem méam), your presence and mature Catholic faith can serve as a great example to the younger altar servers and to assist the whole congregation in attentive prayer at Mass.

Adult altar servers need the physical ability to climb the altar steps, carry the cross or candles, help with water and wine cruets, and occasionally to use the incense thurible. Occasionally, Adult Altar Servers may be asked to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion. A training session will be provided.



ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

Flu is a serious disease caused by a virus. It is not the same as the common cold or what people refer to as the "stomach flu". Flu spreads through the air when infected people cough, sneeze or talk, and other people nearby breathe in the virus. The flu virus can also be spread to adults and children when a person wipes their eyes or puts their hands in their mouth or nose after touching a surface that has the flu virus on it. The flu season is unpredictable, but it often occurs from October to May and usually peaks in January or February. Annual flu vaccination is recommended for everyone 6 months and older by the end of October. Although vaccination later in the season can still be beneficial. It takes your body 2 weeks to build up immunity following vaccination, so it's best to get vaccinated before flu starts spreading in your community.

Common flu and COVID 19 symptoms:

- Fever/Chills
- Shortness of breath, difficulty breathing
- Cough
- Extreme tiredness
- Headache
- Stuffy, runny nose
- Vomiting

- Diarrhea
- · Muscle or body aches

Common COVID-19 symptom: • Loss of taste or smell

During the 2019-20 flu season, 199 children died due to flu, which was the highest number ever recorded - except for the 2009 H1N1 flu pandemic. However, during the 2020-21 flu season, 1 child died as a result of flu. The lower number of flu deaths that year is likely due to the prevention methods that were used by many people during the COVID pandemic that year such as avoiding large crowds, social distancing, wearing masks and focus on handwashing.

Flu and COVID-19 are both respiratory illnesses that can result in hospitalization or death. Because some of the symptoms of flu and COVID-19 are similar, it may be hard to tell the difference between them based on symptoms alone, and testing may be needed to help confirm a diagnosis.
