Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

HEALTH — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

SEASONAL GATHERINGS — In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS — Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

DISTANCE — Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES — All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

HOLY COMMUNION — Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

TITHING — Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANointing OF THE SICK — If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

A NOTE REGARDING THE 8:00 AM WEEKDAY MASS ON TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. Due to COVID restrictions the children are required to sit in certain pews and next to designated individuals. This is to mitigate the spread of COVID among the students.

If you are an adult attending the 8:00 am Weekday Mass please sit in the back of the church to ensure the students are able to follow the necessary protocols for them to attend Mass and remain safe.

A Note From Your Pastor...

My dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

The Lord has continued to provide us with a moderately temperate winter through the end of the month of January. And so with a few exceptions, the exterior restoration work on church has continued on an almost daily basis. With the installation of the battens on the nave roof, the installation of the slate has rapidly progressed. You will hopefully notice that amid the thousands of Vermont green slates (the same color installed on the steeple), the cross design in red slate is also developing.



Design and fabrication of the tower copper work has continued at the Renaissance shop. The new tower louvers are currently being fabricated. In a few weeks, I hope to be able to see the new steeple cross being created at the shop in Belvedere, IL.



That's some of the good news of our restoration project thus far. But as always in a project of this scope, there are the unexpected dimensions. Closer examination of the limestone caps on the top of the east wall of church revealed numerous cracks, spalling and voids within the stones. Although these stones were patched not so many years ago, a durable water sealant was not applied at the time, and so the freeze/thaw cycle has taken its course on these stones.

With the counsel of the Parish Property Committee, it was decided to remove the east parapet wall stones and replace them with new limestone, as was done on the top of the west parapet wall last month. Weather permitting, the old stones will be removed this coming week; new through-wall copper flashing and stones to be installed the following week.



SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up. Next classes will be in February 2021.

Anointing of the Sick

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.


TIME, TALENT & TREASURE FORMS

R. Do not despise our pleas and deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen.




ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

It seems threats to food safety are in the news constantly. New disease-causing organisms seem to emerge and known pathogens become more virulent. We continue to request foods that are less-processed, requiring more diligence in preparation and delivery. We each need to take practical steps to prevent foodborne illness.

Clean: Wash your hands before, during and after handling food. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), handwashing has the potential to save more lives than any single vaccine or medical intervention. Lather and scrub them well for at least 20 seconds. Air dry or use a clean paper towel.

Separate: It's a good idea to have two cutting boards - one for foods that will be cooked, such as meat, poultry, and seafood, and the other for foods like fruits and vegetables that will be eaten raw. That way the raw foods won't be contaminated by the juices from the ones to be cooked. If you do get a new cutting board, get one that's dishwasher-

safe. The very hot water and strong detergent typically used in dishwashers can eliminate a lot of bacteria.

Cook: Get a food thermometer. Only a food thermometer can make sure meat, poultry, fish, and casseroles are cooked to a safe internal temperature - hot enough to kill any pathogens that may be present.

Chill: Get an appliance thermometer to be sure your refrigerator is at or **below 40°F**. Between 40°F and 140°F is the Danger Zone when bacteria multiply rapidly. Most refrigerators have just a colder/warmer adjustment, so the only way to know the temperature is to put a thermometer inside. Also put one in the freezer to be sure the temperature is **0°F or below**.
