#### Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

**HEALTH** — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

**SEASONAL GATHERINGS** – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS — Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

**DISTANCE** – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

**HYMNALS & MISSALETTES** – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

**HOLY COMMUNION** – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

**TITHING** – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. A Note From Your Pastor...

My dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

A renewed blessed New Year to each and everyone of you as our Season of Christmas comes to a close with the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. I again mean to express my many sincere thanks to all of you who have sent greetings, best wishes and other edible goodies. I would be remiss if I didn't express thanks for all who assisted in our parish's celebration of Our Lord's

Nativity, among them our parish musicians, the members of the Holy Name Society who erected our crèche, and parishioners who provided for the excellent livestreaming of Masses for the sanctification of the Lord's people



within our local community and across the country. The Lord finally provided a dusting of snow to cap our season.

A brief, but well-deserved respite was provided to our parish contractors during Christmas. With the relatively temperate

weather, they are now back to work with gusto. With the placement of the west parapet wall capstones, tuck pointing continues on both east and west ends of church. The Renaissance Roofing crew assigned to the tower has almost



completed the installation of the slate on the steeple.

Weather permitting, the new copper "hip flashing" will soon be installed on the steeple. Because slate, and any worthy roofing material for that matter, is part of an overall system; with the 43# felt underneath the slate, "hip flashing" covers the vertical exposed edges of the steeple to prevent water penetration. While the new 20 oz. copper will eventually tarnish, eventually developing a patina, once the scaffolding is removed, our church steeple will be a very visible feature.

On the nave of church, the installation of the vertical members of the batten system has begun. As you hopefully remember from previous bulletin notes, there are lateral undulations between the roof trusses and joints, as well as vertical variations across the 138 year old roof deck. The battens will provide a consistent, level nailing surface to which the nave slate will be attached.

So, on that note and as it's a new year, let me conclude with an architectural question: What's the difference between a joist and a girder?




#### **KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MEMBERSHIP**

#### ST. PETER PARISH CSA GOAL: \$125,000.00





Mrs. Zumwalt's fourth grade class began their first day back with a small prayer service in the classroom to celebrate the Epiphany.

Epiphany marks the occasion of a time-honored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors." The formula for the ritual is simple: take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 21.

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of



the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "21" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.


