





A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear friends in the Lord,

There is a story told about the presentation of the plans for the new Pontifical North American College in Rome. After the tumult and destruction of the Second World War, expatriated seminarians again were returning to the Eternal City for their education and Pope Pius XII selected Count Enrico Pietro Galeazzi to design a whole new seminary complex on extra-territorial Vatican property on the Janiculum Hill. As Count Galeazzi presented his drawing for the large modern building, the pope diligently examined them and declared that they were impressive and that it was designed as "A building for angels!" The Count was initially overwhelmed by the statement, but then came to understand what the pontiff really meant as he continued, "because there are no restrooms!"

Restroom facilities are almost ubiquitous for both public and private buildings in modern times and we can forget that they are an integral part of building construction in civilized society. If you've ever undertaken a home improvement project, you're probably aware that you're bound to discover unexpected and forgotten things. Such was the case with our exterior restoration work on St. Peter Church during the past two years...and so it continues with our summer project on the north side of St. Peter School. In planning for the replacement of the retaining wall between the Vogelweid Building and the old garages, it became apparent that what was buried in the ground there was rather unknown.


Last week, as one of our contractors was chipping concrete with a mini-excavator, a hole about 10 feet deep opened up beneath him. Further investigation showed that the hole was lined with limestone and had a masonry arch on one side. The City of Jefferson was of course interested in this, since a 10" clay tile sewer line was also observed in this subterranean structure. And so yours truly took to examining old maps of the City of Jefferson.

As you might be aware, by at least 1892 a 14" public water line had been laid under West Main Street from the water plant to supply the growing neighborhoods east of Wears Creek. It wasn't until 1896 that the first sewer lines were laid in this portion of the city, with one (or possibly two) running under the alley between St. Peter Church and what is now the Selinger Centre Building (built in 1937). But as early as 1885, there is

documentation of a small square wooden structure just to the west of St. Peter Church and adjacent to the alley. After construction of the parish school in 1889, the structure continues to be present on maps and only later is it identified as "WC". (Perhaps some of you are catching a whiff of where I'm going with this...) And so it would seem that the stone work rediscovered last week was from our parish's first "water closet". When exactly this outdoor facility ceased to be used is unknown, but definitely by the construction of St. Peter High School in 1931, the WC had been wiped clean off the map.



ALICE KUEHN'S NURSES NOTES

June is National Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Month. Fresh fruits and veggies are plentiful in the summertime and good for you! One of the most delicious ways to get your "fruits and veggis" is eating berries! A research study in 2012 showed that eating berries at least once a week may protect the brain from age-related memory loss. A study including more than 16,000 women compared those who ate the most blueberries and strawberries to those who ate the fewest and found that those who ate the most had a slower rate of developing memory problems. The difference was equal to about two-and-a-half years of aging. "This is pretty compelling evidence to suggest that berries do appear to have memory benefits," says researcher Elizabeth E. Devore, ScD, instructor in medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston. She noted that the biggest berry eaters in the study weren't eating mounds of them every day. On average, they were eating a single half-cup serving of blueberries or two half-cup servings of strawberries each week. Note that the study didn't prove that berries protected the women's brains directly, but after researchers adjusted their results to account for differences like exercise and income, having a diet high in fruits and vegetables, particularly berries, still appeared to be linked to having a sharper memory. 


