

#### Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Bishop W. Shawn McKnight has issued a decree lifting the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person, effective June 1, 2021.

Please know that modified protocols while attending Mass are in effect at St. Peter Church.

**HEALTH** – Dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person is lifted effective June 1, 2021. Those with underlying health issues who are currently not vaccinated are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings. We request that you continue to check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Individuals who are ill are strongly encouraged to stay home. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Mass.

MASKS – Masks are strongly enouraged upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask and would like to wear one.

**DISTANCE** – All pews in the church are now open. We strongly encourage everyone to wear masks when you are not able to social distance. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

**HYMNALS & MISSALETTES** – All hymnals and missalettes have now been returned to the pews. In addition, Missalettes are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. Weekly bulletins are currently available in the mailbox at the rectory porch. We will continue to post the song texts for Sunday Mass on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

**HOLY COMMUNION** – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

**TITHING** – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

#### A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR...

Dear friends in Christ.

It's been a few weeks since I've been able to correspond with you in this forum. This week, I want to give you all an overall breakdown of the work that will be occurring in church during the next few summer months.

First of all, beginning Monday, June 14, the upper church will be closed for the interior restoration work. The 12:03 pm Mass on Monday, June 14, as well as the 8:00 am & 12:03 pm Mass on Tuesday, June 15 will be in the chapel. After June 15, all daily and weekend Masses will be offered in Selinger Centre until further notice. From July 5-July 30, only the Mass at 12:03 pm will be offered in Selinger Centre, as Fr. Paschal will be away for a culture and language program at Conception Abbey.

During the week of June 14th, the reconstruction of the sanctuary steps and the removal of the pews will begin. Once the pews have been disassembled for their transport to the Ratigan-Schottler shop in Beatrice, Nebraska for refinishing, during the week of June 21, the flooring in the narthex and the carpeting in the nave and side entrance will be removed. During this time, HVAC work will be occurring with the replacement of the church boiler and improvements to the sanctuary and sacristy ductwork. The pipe organ will be protected again dust and debris.

ARSI will begin the asbestos remediation on or about July 1. It is estimated that the removal of asbestos will take about three weeks. After that point, the installation, sanding and sealing of oak hardwood in the nave and sanctuary will begin.

All of this, admittedly, is on a very tight time schedule; however, I promise to keep you informed about the progress of this project. Kindly remember that this project is being undertaken at the instruction of our Bishop to increase the seating capacity of our church, to attend to the wear of our church flooring, pews and kneelers, to restore the altar rails to a functional location, to provide more ample and beautiful confessionals, all completed in time for the scheduled weddings in the fall and the significant time that our daughter parish (the Cathedral of St. Joseph) will be closed for it's renovation.

Among many of the other lessons that this past year and a half has taught us is the need to be more flexible and adaptable in pursuing the greater good that Almighty God intends to bring about. I would ask that you keep that attribute of flexibility, along with the virtues of charity and patience, in mind as we proceed forward.



#### **Holy Matrimony**



# WHAT IS LIFE ALL ABOUT? WHAT'S REALLY IMPORTANT?

#### **ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES**

June is National Diary Month . Founded by America's dairy farmers 100 years ago, the National Dairy Councill's "3-A-Day" theme for dairy products was created to remind us to get 3 daily servings of milk, cheese or yogurt for stronger bones and better bodies. The National Dairy Council's fascinating information regarding pregnancy and the newborn begun last week now continues:

"By 12 months, a newborn's brain doubles in size; by 36 months, it triples to almost adult size. Previously, people believed the baby's personality, their ability to think and learn and even their social skills were largely driven by their DNA. However, it turns out experiences play a contributory role and can have an enormous effect, especially for young children. The period from conception through the first three years of life has an explosive rate of linear growth, tissue development and brain expansion. For optimal development, particularly in the brain, it is critical that early exposures are positive. Maternal, infant and toddler nutrition play a substantial role on growth and development as well, demonstrating that growth and development are multifactorial.

To fuel this growth, the infant brain uses over 50 percent of daily calories. We often hear about how important iron, zinc, choline and DHA are during this time. But it takes a consistent supply of many different nutrients to build, expand, fuel and maintain the brain. Food choices matter. In the absence of breast milk. iron-fortified infant formula are the most appropriate substitutes for feeding healthy, full-term infants during the first year of life. After the first year, cow's milk can also be introduced as a nutrient-rich food choice for infants. Nutrient-rich foods help contribute to a healthy infant and toddler dietary pattern that helps support their growth spurt. Eliminating nutrient-rich foods from the infant solid food diet may have unintended nutrient intake consequences." (Source: National Dairy Council). For more information see http://www.3aday.org.
