### Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Bishop W. Shawn McKnight has issued a decree lifting the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person, effective June 1, 2021.

Please know that modified protocols while attending Mass are in effect at St. Peter Church.

**HEALTH** – Dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person is lifted effective June 1, 2021. Those with underlying health issues who are currently no vaccinated are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public. We request that you continue to check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Individuals who are ill are strongly encouraged to stay home. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Mass.

**MASKS** – Masks are strongly enouraged upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask and would like to wear one.

**DISTANCE** – All pews in the church are now open. We strongly encourage everyone in the to wear masks when you are not able to social distance. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

**HYMNALS & MISSALETTES** – All hymnal have now been returned to the pews. Missalettes will be returned to the pews after Pentecost Sunday. In addition, Missalettes are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. Weekly bulletins are currently available in the mailbox at the rectory porch. We will continue to post the song texts for Sunday Mass on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

**HOLY COMMUNION** – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

**TITHING** – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.



#### Holy Matrimony



WHAT IS LIFE ALL ABOUT? WHAT'S REALLY **IMPORTANT?** How life-changing the Cursillo Covid pandemic has been for all of us this

June is *National Diary Month*. Dairy foods provide nine essential nutrients, including calcium, potassium, phosphorus, protein, vitamins A, D and B12, riboflavin, and niacin. Here is some fascinating information regarding pregnancy and the newborn:

"During pregnancy, a mother's nutrition can directly affect the growing fetus... Unhealthy weight gain during pregnancy), exposure to toxins (tobacco, alcohol, drugs), physical/metabolic health (blood pressure, diabetes) and mental health (stress, depression) shape all aspects of fetal development – not only size and function of cells, tissues and organs, but also the body's signaling and metabolism. The baby's future health as an adult – and the risk for problems such as obesity, hypertension, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, depression, bipolar disease and stress responses - can be reflected in their fetal experiences. Immediately after birth, the newborn's 85 billion brain cells begin to wire together, forming connections at a stunning 700 brain cells per second. This "responsiveness" continues after birth

and is most remarkable in the infant's brain. The brain will add 1 percent volume every day over the first few months. Neurons in specific regions are exquisitely in tune with human facial expressions, eyes, gestures and voices. The newborn takes on an extraordinary sensory-motor exploration of their world. What looks like play is discovery, and the infant's future cognitive ability is founded on it." This information on the newborn will conclude next week as we further discuss infant development and nutritional needs.
