Ashley Eskens, a junior at Helias Catholic High School, processed in to crown the Blessed Mother. Fresh flowers were presented to Mary. Songs and prayers were sung and recited in honor of Mary, our Mother, and Patron of Ladies Sodality.

Special guests were Ashley Eskens and her mother Peggy. Ashley is active in Helias track, float committee, stage crew, archery. A busy month – Ashley was confirmed last Monday, and she is studying for finals.

At last year's May meeting Ashley and her sister Emily (who is a senior this year) talked about attending NCYC in 2015. They attended NCYC again in November 2017. Ashley talked about memorable experiences there!

Father Simeon. His Recent Trip Home.

It is always interesting to hear Father Simeon talk about his family and homeland! He visited in March, which happens to be a lower-plane-fare-rate month. It had been 10 months since he had last seen his family. His grandfather, who is almost 100 years old, is very ill, and Father Simeon was honored to anoint him.

It was a long 7 hour flight, with lots of lay-overs. Columbia, Missouri, to Chicago to Frankfurt, Germany; to Nigeria. 5 hour wait; a 1 hour layover, which he almost missed the connecting flight because Father did not know which gate number; and then 6 hours on roads filled with potholes to drive home.

Father Simeon is the 1st of 5 children. His mom was a school teacher. His dad worked for the government. His parents are now empty-nesters. His brothers and sisters are married and now live miles away. All his brothers and sisters (except 1) came to the main family home to visit.

His ancestral home is 25 miles from his parents' current home. There is so much poverty and suffering. Father sends home about half of his salary. He sponsors 5 disadvantaged children so they can attend school and have lunches.

While he is here, Father sometimes shops at Goodwill. Father likes to bring gifts, which he takes on his trips home. For example, recently he found a laptop for \$100, which was a well-received gift! Gift suggestions: clothes, shoes, used laptops.

Interesting notes: In his home country, Mass lasts 3 hours, which includes a long homily and lots of singing! Life expectancy is about 55-60 years. Most kids attend boarding school. The school Father Simeon attended was 80 miles from his home. His high school seminary. Not good food. No snacks. No parents visiting.

Northern Nigeria is mostly Muslim. Southern Nigeria is Christian. His family live in the middle of the country. In late April just recently, in Northern Nigeria, 19 people and 2 priests were killed by the group Boko Haram during a weekday Mass.

Father Simeon was first assigned to Germany. He had to learn that language. Was there about 3 years before coming to our Jefferson City diocese. There never seem to be enough priests, in his homeland, nor here.

April 29 church bulletin included summary Parish Council minutes.

Proposals for a name for the newly-remodeled space were considered. The most-likely candidate is the Father Kevin Gormley Hospitality Center.

Personally, I would like to see our newly-remodeled cafeteria named after Jesus, Mary, or a Saint. Today I am proposing: **Our Lady of Guadalupe Hospitality Center.**

She is Patroness of all the Americas. Our Lady is Patroness of Ladies Sodality.

Some of the members of Ladies Sodality who were present at this evening's meeting, signed a sheet of paper, recommending "Guadalupe Hospitality Center".

Another name suggested is the "Saint Martha Hospitality Center."

Notes from Tour of Basement Cafeteria. May 1.

Remodeled Selinger Basement Cafeteria, Kitchen, Extra Meeting Room.

Remodel for Selinger Center basement cafeteria is expected to be completed in May or June!

Michelle Truesdale, Joyce Amick, Gloria Johnson, Sallie Keeney, Cheryl Buechter were present for the tour, guided by Jack Kramer, who also showed us the floor plan.

Seating comfortably for 186, or 212, or with tables closer together 236.

Michelle would like to purchase 26 or 27 tables for the cafeteria. Some 5 foot, some 4 foot tables. Maybe some round tables. Jack recommends 28 (8 foot) tables and 4 (5 foot) tables. Jack has sample table configurations, with tables beginning behind the first column.

Upon entering, there is a large room for tables and chairs storage.

Kitchen:

A big center island will have griddles (used for pancake breakfasts) and huge bowls (for making chili, or Lions Club ham and beans. The island area will have huge exhaust fans above, mandated by Jefferson City code.

Stand-up stacking warmers will be located by the windows.

Refrigerator / Freezer combo, similar to what is in Selinger upstairs kitchen.

No built-in cabinets. We will re-use the stainless steel cabinets / countertops which were originally there in the cafeteria. 2 or 3 of those cabinets.

Refreshment area. 300 cup coffee pot. Ice machine. Small sink. Refrigerator. Cabinet storage space beneath the countertop.

Ladies Sodality / Funeral Dinner. Lockable closet. Shelves will be installed soon.

Electrical panels and water heater are in a closet next to Ladies Sodality closet.

New bathrooms. Finished!

Meeting room in back of the cafeteria area is nearing completion. Storage cabinets can be installed here.

Poured floor.

The main entrance to basement cafeteria (in the alley-way) is handi-cap accessible. As before, there is a door and steps to Selinger Center.

Programmable door locks. Key to cafeteria. Key to the kitchen.

We are so excited about these renovations!
