Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

HEALTH — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

SEASONAL GATHERINGS – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS — Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

DISTANCE – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

HOLY COMMUNION – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

TITHING – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

Please note that the 8:00 am Weekday Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is when the children from St. Peter Interparish School attend Mass. I frequently receive inquiries and questions about how long the exterior restoration of St. Peter church is going to take. Although some have inferred, perhaps at the inspiration of a local political cartoon, that it will be a multi-year project that would be equivalent to the restoration of our noble legislative neighbor across Broadway, that is simply not the case.

I am very happy and proud to announce to you that the

installation of slate on the nave of church has been completed this week. With the installation of the new east parapet wall capstones, their grouting and caulking also being completed, the installation of copper counterflashing has continued on both the east and west end of church.

The installation of the slate on the apse of church is also completed. Copper work on the ridges and hips continue.

Some of you might have noticed and wonder why some of the new copper counter-flashing work has a "saw-tooth" appearance to it. In the



is meant to follow the already established mortar lines between the bricks, rather than sawing through the existing brick face. As I hope all of you appreciate, the locally-fired bricks provided by Mr. G.H. Dulle that were used to construct our beloved church of St. Peter 138 years ago are rather soft, and do not have the water-repellant "hard-fired" qualities of more modern brick. This is, of course, no offense to the brick-making technology of the 19th century in the local wilds of central Missouri; rather, it is a testimony to the basic technologies used in a particular era. I suppose it does beg the question: what have you created that will last 100 years or more?

Work on the tower louvers continues, and in a few weeks, the four clock faces and hands will be repainted. The new lightning protection system is beginning to be installed as well.

Until the next restoration and construction update, I remain yours in Christ - Fr. Secrist

Holy Matrimony





ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

As we continue through Lent, we are asked to contemplate on where we are spiritually, working on our prayer life, penance, and giving in service to others. Kind of a "spiritual spring -cleaning". Along those same lines, perhaps you are also working on household spring cleaning. One major issue that often comes up is how to dispose of household hazardous waste. Leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, flammable, or reactive ingredients are considered to be household hazardous waste. If disposed of improperly, these materials can spread into our soil, air, and water causing harm to ecosystems and human health. The Cole County Household Hazardous Waste Facility opened in March of 2011 and is dedicated to assisting residents in proper disposal of these items to ensure materials did not end up in local streams, ditches, or rights-of-way. It serves all residents of Cole County, including those in the City of Jefferson. Waste MUST BE from residential home use,

not commercial or business waste and is by appointment only. To schedule an appointment go to www.hhwscheduling. as.me

The 2021 Household Hazardous Waste drop off dates are as follows: March 17, April 14, May 19, June 16, September 1, September 15, and October 6.

Examples of accepted items include: Oil-Based Paints, Acids, Adhesives & Glues, Aerosol Cans, Ammonia, and Antifreeze.


Examples of items not accepted include: Latex Paint, Single Use Batteries, NiCad/ NIMH batteries, and Ammunition.
