# THE VERB by Msgr. Kurwicki

I would like to begin by presenting you with some updates:

We have signed a contract to have the acoustics in our church professionally inspected. When these test results are in, we will be able to begin the process of selecting a new public address system in our beautiful church. Once that is completed, we will be able to have a cost analysis for a new sound system- which includes new speakers. As you recall, our current system is 23 years old.

We also heard this week that the three new windows that have been ordered for the priest's sacristy in church will be installed after Easter.

I want to draw your special attention to the ad in the bulletin this weekend for the upcoming Diocesan Stewardship Conference at the Cathedral on Saturday, April 13. This is necessary to better understand the spirituality of stewardship and how it can be applied in our parish. We are making strides in this effort, but we can dive deeper to understand how this model benefits all of us.

I will be away this week on vacation since it is Spring Break for the Missouri House. I will be visiting family in Illinois. Fr. Alber will take care of all your needs. As there will be only one priest on campus, there is only 1 Mass per day, and that will be 12:03pm. Please plan accordingly.

The Diocese of Jefferson City has updated their website to include a new whistleblower hotline that anyone can use to report financial misconduct, human resources concerns or any other issues. **The hotline number is: 573-635-0386.** 

Information about the hotline is available at the top of the **diojeffcity.org** webpage via the "Report Abuse or Misconduct" link. This page also includes instructions for the existing methods of reporting abuse.

The new whistleblower hotline is available in both English and Spanish. Callers are prompted to leave a message with their concerns. The message will immediately be sent by email to three people — one Chancery employee and two lay people who are not employees of the diocese. The three will confer and ensure the issue is properly investigated.

*The Catholic Missourian* also has information about the hotline in the Feb. 16 issue.

All parishes are encouraged to inform the faithful about the whistleblower hotline and to use it for any concerns that arise.

Lucile Morris Upton landed her first newspaper job out West in the early I 920s, then returned home to spend half a century reporting on the Ozarks world she knew best. Having come of age just as women gained the right to vote, she took advantage of the opportunities that presented themselves in a changing world. During her years as a journalist, Upton rubbed shoulders with presidents, flew with aviation pioneer Wiley Post, covered the 20th century's worst single killing of U.S. police officers, wrote an acclaimed book on the Bald Knobbers vigilante group, charted the growth of Ozarks tourism and spearheaded a movement to preserve iconic regional history sites. Following retirement from her newspaper career, she put her experience to good use as a community activist and member of the Springfield City Council. Told largely through Upton's own words, Susan Croce Kelly's insightful biography captures the excitement of front lines newsgathering in the days when the whole world depended on newspapers to learn of current events.
