Following the release of Bishop McKnight's August 21 Decree, the following REVISED protocols are now in effect for all Masses — Weddings and Funerals included — at St. Peter Parish until further notice.

Please know that we are carefully monitoring all directives and guidelines issued by state and local governments, as well as by the Diocese of Jefferson City, and will re-evaluate and adjust these protocols as warranted.

HEALTH — All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice provided the Lord's Day is kept holy by participating in the live-streamed Sunday Mass; praying with the readings of the Sunday Mass; and/or reciting the rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those with underlying health issues are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public gatherings such as Sunday Mass. Please check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic for COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Sunday Mass.

SEASONAL GATHERINGS – In-person seasonal gatherings outside of Mass, such as penance services or vespers are discouraged.

MASKS — Everyone must wear a mask upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask.

DISTANCE – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals, missalettes and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps. Printed missalettes and weekly bulletins are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. If you pick up a missalette, please take it home with you. The song texts for Sunday Mass can be found on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

HOLY COMMUNION – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

TITHING – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.



Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up. Next classes will be in February 2021.

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.





Fifth Sunday in Lent March 28, 2021



The St. Peter Conference of The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul has strived to provide support for the poor and needy in ways that are underserved by other organizations. Our goal is to be as generous as possible within our means without duplicating assistance already being provided by other organizations. So far that includes:

- Rides to Mass, doctor appointments, and similar important destinations to those who either cannot afford transportation or who need to be accompanied.
- Help prevent utilities from being disconnected. Having electric, gas, or water service disconnected has a domino effect; without electricity or water the home becomes uninhabitable. Families may become separated as children may be removed from the home. Not having utilities usually breaks the rental lease and the family may become homeless. By stepping in to prevent disconnection we help prevent further crises for the family being served.
- Provide basic twin size mattresses with priority given to children. Many of the people we help have had to move recently and, with no truck available, leave many possessions behind. Mattresses are particularly difficult to move without a truck and so many end up sleeping directly on the floor.
- Other types of assistance may be given, but these are the most common.

Common Ground is a community service agency located in the heart of Jefferson City at the corner of Clark and Atchison Streets. They are dedicated to helping neighbors in the Jefferson City area reach their full potential. What started as a small ministry of churches in downtown Jefferson City, has grown into a vital community partner offering solutions surrounding homelessness and homelessness prevention. Common Ground provides financial assistance in the form of rent, utilities, bus passes, gas vouchers, medical copays, and more. They also have a housing program that pairs housing assistance with advocates and financial education. Common Ground works regularly with other agencies in town including Catholic Charities, Salvation Army, Rape and Abuse Crises Services, and Central Missouri Community Action. SCHOLARSHIP

SLATE FROM CHURCH STEEPLE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE

Due to the damage from the hail storm this past March the roof on several buildings had to be replaced. We were able to salvage the original slate from the church steeple that has been in place since 1883. The full slate tiles come in a grey or red color and measure approximately 16"h x 8"w. The red is very limited in quantity. Each slate comes with the St. Peter Catholic Church emblem and rope for hanging. The suggested donation price for the grey slate is \$100.00 and \$150.00 for the red slate. Each tile will come with a certificate of authenticity on the back. Also still available are custom made Christmas ornaments which come in a variety of sizes, approximately 2" to 4". The suggested donation for each ornament is \$20.00. Crosses made from the nails that were used on the roof are available in limited quanitity for a suggested donation of \$20.00. Palm Sunday and Holy Week: Culmination of our Lenten Journey

As we draw closer to the culmination of Lent, we continue to be encouraged to do something extra for another, to do without something you like, and seek forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. These challenges are there to help us rethink our priorities in life and renew/strengthen/ and promote a more healthy spiritual life. As another Lenten journey of conversion began on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17, and ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 1, Holy Mother Church calls all Catholics to a deeper spirit of penance, fasting, almsgiving, prayer and worship, "which express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others" (Catechism of the Catholic Church # 1434 & 1969).

Don't forget to continue to work to strengthen and renew your physical and mental health through adequate rest, appropriate exercise, and a healthy diet.

Here are three tips on little things you can "add" to your diet for even more "healthy eating". Whole grain cereal + sunflower seeds= better immunity, as sunflower seeds are loaded with vitamin E, an antioxidant; Cereal or smoothie + wheat germ = improved cell repair and immune system which need the added zinc, an essential mineral; Garden salad + canned wild salmon = healthier brain and heart, as salmon is loaded with healthy omega-3 fats.
