

THE NURSE'S NOTES: New for Spring – A New Nutrition Facts Label from FDA

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has updated the Nutrition Facts label on packaged foods and drinks. FDA is requiring changes to the Nutrition Facts label based on updated scientific information, new nutrition research, and input from the public. This is the first major update to the label in over 20 years. New design and updated information will help you make informed food choices that contribute to lifelong healthy eating habits. The redesigned label has updated serving sizes to better match how much people eat and larger font size for calories. In addition, new nutrients, like Vitamin D, potassium and added sugars are now listed. FDA is launching an education campaign to reach alert the general population as well as those populations at increased risk of nutritionrelated chronic disease. Manufacturers must declare both the amount and % of Daily Value for vitamins and minerals. Use the label to support your personal dietary needs-choose foods that contain more of the nutrients you want to get more of and less of nutrients you may want to limit. Such as foods that are higher in dietary fiber, vitamin D, calcium, iron, and potassium and lower in saturated fat, sodium, and added sugars. Choosing healthier foods and beverages can help reduce the risk of developing some health conditions, such as high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease, osteoporosis, and anemia. Flu Update: As you all probably know, all nursing homes in the area are restricting all visitors except medical and essential personnel. Therefore, the Caring Neighbors visiting nursing homes are now visiting by phone if possible or mail for the duration. In addition, all home visits are cancelled immediately to protect both the homebound and those Caring Neighbors, esp. over 60. Caring Neighbors will continue to connect with those they usually visit personally by phone or mail or both. If any have no email then we are mailing them the bulletins and other information as well. We ask all parishioners to pleanase let us know if any of the homebound or elderly in the parish need any supplies delivered. St. Vincent de Paul members and members of our Health Committee are getting together a list of "delivery folks" who can bring them essentials such as bread, milk, medicines, etc. Some pharmacies are offering free delivery now. Let us all pray for those we visit, for each other, our parish d school, and for the corona virus to soon be gone.

Scam Warning

The Diocese of Jefferson City warns the public of what appears to be an ongoing phishing scam involving emails and texts purportedly from priests or parish/Chancery staff. This scam has hit many parishes across the United States. The email or text purports to be from a person the target knows, such as one's pastor, a parish staff member, the bishop or someone else from the Church. If the target responds to the fake email or text, the sender will follow up with a request for some sort of monetary assistance, often for gift cards or iTune cards. It is truly unfortunate cyber criminals will attempt to exploit the generous nature of our community. Sending emails or texts asking for cash or gifts cards is not how priests, parishes or the Diocese of Jefferson City seeks financial assistance for our work. If you receive an email or text from a trusted church personnel asking for assistance, confirm by calling that person and do NOT respond to the email or text. Relief Parents, St. Nicholas Academy

St. Nicholas Academy is a supportive living experience for boys from families that are under-resourced who want to give their sons every opportunity to succeed in school and life. St. Nick's partners with families and St. Peter Interparish School to provide this opportunity. St. Nick's is seeking Christian, married couples or single individuals who are willing to be part of a pool of relief parents. The role of relief parents is to care for the boys and home when the full-time house parents are off duty or away.

Typically, the full-time house parents are off duty every fourth weekend from 9:00 AM Friday through 7:00 PM Sunday. Relief parents, on a rotational schedule, fill in during this time. They may also be asked to be on a call list to help fill in when the house parents are on vacation and/or sick.

Relief parents receive an hourly wage, all legally mandated benefits and a compensation package that includes a private suite and all meals for the days on duty.

SAINT POLYCARP (died 155) February 23

"Eighty-six years I have served Christ, and he never did me any wrong. How can I blaspheme my King and Savior?" Boldly answering the official who demanded he worship pagan gods, Polycarp, today's "Senior Citizen Saint," demonstrates that courage, far from being the preserve of the young, is a virtue cultivated through lifelong fidelity and crowned by final perseverance. A disciple of Saint John, who is said to have consecrated him bishop of Smyrna in modern-day Turkey, Polycarp witnesses to the truth that, whatever time and space may separate us, Jesus' gift of the Eucharist unites us. Polycarp's final words, preserved by the Church of Smyrna, sound like a Eucharistic Prayer in which the saint offers himself: "Lord, almighty God, Father of your beloved and blessed Son Jesus Christ, through whom we have come to the knowledge of yourself . . . may I be received among the martyrs as a rich and pleasing sacrifice . . . through the eternal priest of heaven, Jesus Christ . . . through him be glory to you, together with him and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen."
