

Am I My Brother's Keeper? Yes, We Are!

Bishop W. Shawn McKnight has issued a decree lifting the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person, effective June 1, 2021.

Please know that modified protocols while attending Mass are in effect at St. Peter Church.

HEALTH – Dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person is lifted effective June 1, 2021. Those with underlying health issues who are currently no vaccinated are encouraged to avoid the risk of large public. We request that you continue to check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Individuals who are ill are strongly encouraged to stay home. Pews and hard surfaces are sanitized after each Mass.

MASKS – Masks are strongly enouraged upon entering the church, throughout the Mass, and while moving in the Communion Procession to receive Holy Communion. If approaching to receive Holy Communion, please remove your mask just prior to receiving Our Lord, and moving it to cover your mouth and nose while returning to your pew. Please bring a personal mask with you. Ushers will have a limited supply for those who forget to bring a mask and would like to wear one.

DISTANCE – All pews in the church are now open. We strongly encourage everyone in the to wear masks when you are not able to social distance. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnal have now been returned to the pews. Missalettes will be returned to the pews after Pentecost Sunday. In addition, Missalettes are available on the rectory porch for your personal use. Weekly bulletins are currently available in the mailbox at the rectory porch. We will continue to post the song texts for Sunday Mass on our parish Facebook page and parish website.

HOLY COMMUNION – Please follow the directions of the ushers and any floor marking to maintain the six-foot distance between the faithful in the line. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand or on the tongue. For those wishing to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, a kneeler is also provided for your use. The Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their fingers after distributing Holy Communion on the tongue of each individual.

TITHING – Thank you for your continuing generosity in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. There will also be a stationary basket placed in the center aisle during Sunday Masses so that you may leave your contribution there.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK— If at all possible please seek the anointing of the sick from the parish priest before going to the hospital. We cannot guarantee that a priest will either be available or allowed into the hospital because of pandemic protocols.

A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR...

My brothers and sisters in the Lord,

This week, as many of the COVID-19 restrictions and protocols are being relaxed, I first want to start off by thanking our dutiful ushers at our Sunday Masses. This past year has been a challenging time for us all, but it has been a particular test of our ushers' mettle and dedication as those who volunteer to assist and provide for your safety and comfort while at St. Peter Church.

As I hope you can appreciate (and I can testify to this as well), not all who approached the threshold of our parish church have arrived with kind, patient and charitable dispositions, particularly when asked to socially distance and to wear a mask while attending Mass. While it is true that our parish did have stricter protocols than some other parishes, please know that those specific protocols were adopted in response to the direct instructions given by our Bishop in various decrees, the recommendations from the CDC, and because of the thoughtful counsel received from my staff, parish deacons and other parish employees.

I am not a virologist, nor do I attempt to be an armchair epidemiologist, as some have during the past year; but I do strive to be an obedient pastor who tries to respond to the needs of our parishioners, even if some of the decisions I have to make are not universally liked or understood. I am personally very grateful to our ushers for assisting us all in providing a place of worship and prayer where the Lord's faithful could come, even when so many other local churches were closed and locked. When you see the ushers at Mass, please kindly greet them and offer your thanks to them.

In other parish news, I want to provide you with a summary of the church exterior restoration figures as of May 19th, 2021. So far, we have received \$1,515,089.81 from the insurance carrier. The sale of steeple slate and square nails ornaments, as well as the recycling of copper and other metals from church has earned us \$26,679.95 (Kindly note that slate and nail crosses are still available for your purchase). Your donations to the "Extra Repairs Fund" has totaled \$116,714.16, for a total received thus far of \$1,658,483.92. Kindly keep in mind that the insurance company has not fully paid-out on our claim.

The total of unexpected expenses on the church which includes the replacement of vertical timbers and all of the 1" underlayment on the steeple, the repair and replacement of underlayment in various spots on the rest of the church, the restoration of the apse stained glass windows, the addition of the batten system to level out the nave roof deck, new LED lighting on church, the replacement of the west and east parapet wall capstones and other tuck pointing and water sealing comes to a total of \$297,729.85.

As always, I mean to be forthright and transparent with all of you as we care for our parishioners and the facilities on our campus. Next week, we'll have a visit about the work completed and that which is still underway.

What does the parish nurse do?

I began working as parish nurse at St.

Peter in 2008 and specific areas of practice I have focused on include:

- Health education through flyers and in the bulletin on health and wellness.
- In partnership with the parish priests and deacons, visit parishioners in the hospital, home, hospice, and nursing homes.
- Place and maintain First Aid kits and hand sanitizers throughout the parish facilities.
- Place and maintain AEDs (automatic external defibrillator - church ramp entrance, Selinger Center, St. Peter School).

- Health counseling; assist people in understanding treatments and medications.
- Teach, guide and offer classes our volunteer Caring Neighbors who visit parishioners who make a home visit.
- Facilitate coordination and provide information regarding activities offered in the community such as BP screenings and health fairs.
- Maintain a modest medical equipment loan closet.
- Work with the Health Committee regarding all health related issues and education.
