A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear St. Peter Parishioners,

Beginning Monday, May 4th, public Masses will begin to be celebrated at St. Peter Parish.

However, the Mass schedule will **not** be the same as before the COVID-19 pandemic began, so please read carefully.

Monday — Friday: 12:03 pm in church
Saturday Vigil: 4:30 pm
Sunday: 9:00 am & Noon

In order to protect the health of our fellow parishioners and to comply with current pandemic guidelines and mandates issued by our state and local government and the Diocese of Jefferson City, the following protocols are now in effect for public Masses at St. Peter Parish. Please know that we will respectfully, but firmly, enforce these so that all may be protected.

HEALTH – All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass through June 30, 2020. Those who at risk because of an underlying health issue, or who are over 60, are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass. Check your temperature and general well-being before coming to church. Those who are symptomatic are not permitted to enter church.

MASK – Everyone must wear a mask when entering and exiting church and throughout the celebration of Mass, with the exception of the brief time if you are receiving Holy Communion. You **must** bring a personal mask with you. The parish will **not** provide masks.

DISTANCE – Everyone must maintain a distance of six feet from family groups and/or other individuals. Please follow the directions of our ushers and any signs or markings on pews and in the aisles.

HYMNALS & MISSALETTES – All hymnals, missalettes, bulletins and other paper materials are stored until after the pandemic protocols are lifted. We encourage you to bring your smartphone to reference prayers, readings, songs and other devotions that are available through various mobile apps.

NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR CONTINUED...

CAPACITY – In order to maintain safe spacing for all, attendance at each Mass will be limited at approximately 200. Please arrive early, and wait at the front door of church so that our ushers can direct you to your seats. Please follow their directions so that as many as possible can be safely seated.

DOORS – When Mass begins at the stated time, no one else will be admitted so that we can maintain the safe capacity and distancing for all. In other words, don't arrive late for Mass.

HOLY COMMUNION – Follow the directions of the ushers and any signs or floor marking to form the single-file Communion line. Ushers may assist in maintaining the six-foot distance between individuals in the line. During this time, Communion will only be distributed in the hand in keeping with the advice of health officials and thereby avoiding the fingers of the Minister of Holy Communion from coming into possible contact with saliva.

TITHING – Thank you for your continuing generosity to our parish in this challenging time. Please continue to make use of automatic bank drafts, credit card offerings, mailed contributions, or placing envelopes in the slot on the rectory porch. The basket will not be passed during Mass.

Bishop McKnight's May Prayer Intention

As we honor the Mother of our Lord as the "Queen of May," may there be a greater respect and appreciation for all women on earth who nourish us in mind, body and soul.

May – the Month of Mary



Our Catholic practice of assigning a special devotion to each month goes back to the early 16th century. In the early years of the 19th century, it quickly spread throughout the Western Church, and, by the time of Pope Pius IX's declaration of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in 1854, it had become universal. In May, there are several feast days honoring our Blessed Mother: May 13. Our Lady of Fatima May 24. Mary, Help of Christians May 31. Pentecost - Decent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary & the Apostles.

Also in May, four authenticated apparitions of our Blessed Mother are commemorated: In 1830, Mary appeared to St. Catherine Laboure and instructed her to have the Miraculous Medal struck with the inscription, "Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."

In 1846, Mary appeared to the children of La Salette, France, and tearfully lamented the lax practice of the faith. In 1858, Mary appeared to St. Bernadette at Lourdes, identifying herself as the "Immaculate Conception." On May 13, 1917, Mary appeared to the three children at Fatima, where she instructed the people to pray the rosary daily for peace.

Although we are unable to be together for a May Crowning this year, our Blessed Mother can be honored in our hearts and in our homes. Each family can gather before a statue of Mary, present flowers, recite the rosary and other prayers, sing Marian songs.

The Memorare

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

Hail Holy Queen

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! Amen.

Alice Kuehn's Nurse Notes

Welcome to May – The month of Mary

Remember to thank God for the beauty of flowers, plants and gardens bursting forth. Working with gardens or even house plants can lift your spirits. Remember, too, that May is the month of the Rosary – pray to Mary for peace and health and respect for all peoples, of all ages, and in all walks of life. Respect for others also includes taking good care of your health and being considerate of others by practicing good health habits especially during this time of COVID-19 when we need to persist in our practices of staying home, washing hands frequently, keep your hands off your face, wearing a mask when you must go out and interact with others for essential needs and remember social distancing (6 ft apart).

Questions regarding COVID-19:

How long can coronavirus live on clothes? With new NHS guidelines released by the Department of Health suggesting that healthcare professionals and other frontline workers can reuse PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) folks are wondering how long the virus can survive on clothing and other fabrics. Currently, scientists cannot provide science-backed information on how long Covid-19 can live on clothes. But the New England Journal of Medicine listed a study earlier this year which found that the virus can live on cardboard for up to 24 hours. <https://www.nejm.org/doi/full/10.1056/NEJMc2004973> Given that there's some similarity between the fibers in cardboard, and those found in fabrics, many scientists concluded – for the time being – that Coronavirus might survive for a similar amount of time on clothing. This is further corroborated by a study on the SARS virus in 1905 where researchers tested the lifespan of the virus on paper samples, as well as on a cotton gown, and concluded that the virus could survive for up to 24 hours, depending on the concentration of the virus.



Relief Parents, St. Nicholas Academy

St. Nicholas Academy is a supportive living experience for boys from families that are under-resourced who want to give their sons every opportunity to succeed in school and life. St. Nick's partners with families and St. Peter Interparish School to provide this opportunity. St. Nick's is seeking Christian, married couples or single individuals who are willing to be part of a pool of relief parents. The role of relief parents is to care for the boys and home when the full-time house parents are off duty or away.

Typically, the full-time house parents are off duty every fourth weekend from 9:00 AM Friday through 7:00 PM Sunday. Relief parents, on a rotational schedule, fill in during this time. They may also be asked to be on a call list to help fill in when the house parents are on vacation and/or sick.

Relief parents receive an hourly wage, all legally mandated benefits and a compensation package that includes a private suite and all meals for the days on duty.
