Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

## **Baptism**

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

If you are preparing for surgery, please our your priests know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.



## **BOOK OF THE NAMES OF THE DEAD**

The Book of the Names of the Dead was inspired by the ancient practice of recording the dates of the deaths of loved ones in a necrology, a public record or registry of death. This practice provides the living with an opportunity for healing and consolation in the face of grief. The Book of the Names of the Dead will be displayed from the solemnity of All Saints until the beginning of Advent. It is left open for people to write the names of their deceased loved ones and for others to read the names, remember, and pray for the repose of their souls. Remembering all of these men and women who have gone before us, "marked with the sign of faith," helps us better understand and appreciate our faith in the Christ our risen Lord who conquers sin and death and brings new life to all.

## **ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES**

Gratitude can be defined as the appreciation of what is meaningful and valuable to you, a state of thankfulness. It is a powerful gift from God that has many benefits. Studies show that practicing gratitude has been shown to improve physical and mental health, enhance sleep, increase empathy, reduce aggression, increase social connection, enhance self- esteem, and improve mental strength/resiliency. Here are a few ways to practice gratitude this holiday season:

Journal or Gratitude Jar. Find a journal or decorate a jar or small box. Each day, write down 3-5 things you are grateful for. (Jar: Write them on slips of paper and watch as the jar fills up each day.)

**Gratitude Rock.** Find a small rock (or other item) that can fit in your pocket or display in a familiar place. Anytime you see it or touch it, pause to consider at least one thing you are grateful for.

**Gratitude Tree/Flower.** For crafty people or families, take some time to create a small tree, flower, or garden. On the leaves or petals, write down things you

are grateful for. Display in a central place in the home where it may inspire further reflection and gratitude.

Gratitude Game. For young children: Go on an adventure through the frowny forest, sad swamp, and mad mountain. The only way to make it through each place is by declaring 3 things each person is grateful for. You will end up at the gratitude garden (where a snack or dessert may be provided.)

Notes, Letters, Phone Calls or Visits. Telling loved ones the reasons why you are grateful for them is a powerful activity and has a positive impact on all involved.

With each of these activities, make sure to spend time thanking your Creator, the giver of all your blessings. "Rejoice always. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)


