



Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and *at least a minimum of six months* prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

Anointing of the Sick

If you are preparing for surgery, please our your priests know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.

Inquiry sessions for those interested in joining the Catholic Church and receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist will began on September 12, 2022 at 6:30 pm in Msgr. 
CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP APPEAL

St. Peter Church parish goal is \$130,050.


Parishes are eligible to receive a rebate when pledges meet or exceed the goal by March 15, 2023 and pledges are fulfilled by the fiscal year end June 30, 2023.

The new Diocesan Stewardship process emphasizes stewardship as a way of life.

We are part of the third group of parishes to implement the process within the diocese. To begin the transition at St. Peter Church, Fr. Stephen Jones will be speaking at all Masses the weekend of November 5 and 6, 2022. He will then lead a presentation on Stewardship to the entire parish community to be held in the Selinger Centre Gym at 6:00 pm on Thursday, November 10, 2022. Please mark your calendars, gather your questions and plan to attend.


Last year, we participated in the outreach and our students did an amazing job! This year, we have set a goal to bless 200 impoverished children in Latin America and the Caribbean!
