RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION AT THE RAIL

With the restoration of the Communion rails to a functional location at St. Peter Church, here are some practical instructions.


Those who desire to receive Holy Communion at the rail - either kneeling or standing - are invited to come forward at Holy Communion and spread out along the full length of the rail, not just at the end closest to the aisle. A priest or deacon will make his way back and forth along the rail, so there's no worry that you'll be missed. If you kneel to receive Holy Communion, there is no need to bow or genuflect before receiving as kneeling itself is a proper show of reverence to our Eucharistic Lord.

As you are patiently waiting to receive Your Lord in Holy Communion, please be contemplating the One whom you are to receive. The reception of Holy Communion is not about the rapid speed at which a task needs be accomplished so that we can move on, but rather about the Lord's People receiving the Lord of Life.

Many people find receiving Our Lord on the tongue is more natural and more comfortable due to the height at which the Host is distributed at the rail. Although they have not yet arrived, please know that kneeler pads are on order in order to aid your knees.

Once you have received the Host, prayerfully make your way back to your seat in church in order to give thanks for the great Eucharistic gift.

Holy Matrimony

The first step in planning a wedding at St. Peter is to contact the Pastor. You may call to check available dates beforehand, but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by the priest and at least a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date. Any Catholic being married needs to have received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism

Parental preparation is required for a child to be baptized. Please plan to attend the required class prior to your child's birth. Sessions are usually held once a quarter. Please call the Parish Office to sign up.

If you are preparing for surgery, please let your priest know before you go to the hospital. Because of COVID-19, the possibility of receiving the Anointing of the Sick after you've been admitted to hospital is not guaranteed.







ALICE KUEHN'S NURSE NOTES

EXERCISE AND YOU, PART 2: The three types of exercise include spiritual, mental and physical. We "exercise" and stretch our spiritual faculties through prayer and meditation, read scripture, study our faith, participate in Mass, attend retreats, read spiritual books, and other "spiritual exercises: we "exercise our mind", with reading, playing board games, playing cards, solving crossword puzzles, learning a language, learning a musical instrument and/or other activities that stretch our minds, we help keep our mental faculties active and alive. Continuing with the third type of exercise - physical activity, where we "exercise our body", there are four basic categories—endurance, strength, balance, and flexibility. The first two categories were described last Sunday and we finish with the last two categories below.

Balance exercises help prevent falls, a common problem in older adults and include suggestions such as standing on one foot, heel-to-toe walk, and Tai Chi. Flexibility exercises stretch your muscles and can help your body stay limber.

Being flexible gives you more freedom of movement for other exercises as well as

for your everyday activities and include shoulder and upper arm stretch, calf stretch and Yoga. "Go4 Life" suggests always warm up before stretching exercises—a few minutes of walking works well.

When exercising, to play it safe and reduce your risk of injury:

- Begin your exercise program slowly with low-intensity exercises.
- Wear appropriate shoes for your activity.
- Warm up before exercising, and cool down afterwards.
- Pay attention to your surroundings when exercising outdoors.
- Drink water before, during, and after your workout session, even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Dress appropriately for the temperature outdoors, or opt for an indoor activity if it's very hot or cold.
- If you have specific health conditions, discuss your exercise and physical activity plan with your health care provider.


